ordinary health of body & of perfect mind & memory
Thanks be to God for it, therefore calling to mind the
mortality of our vain & knowing that it is appointed for
all men once to die, Do make & Ordain this my last
will & Testament, And first of all I give my soul into the
hands of almighty God that gave it, & my body I recommend
to the earth to be buried in a decent manner at the discretion
of my Executors, And as touching my worldly affairs, where-
in it hath pleased God to bless me in this life, I give &
dispose of the same in the in the following manner &
form as follows, First of all I give in all my payables
debts may be paid. Here It is my will & I do as well

That my beloved wife Eliza both shall have the one third
 of all my land with the mansion house during her
 natural life time, together with the black mare her saddle
 & bridle & likewise her bed & furniture & two parts of
 my kitchen furniture with the chest of drawers
 together with two cows; Then I have already give
 all that I allow my son in law Samuel Parks &
 my son Joseph & my son in law Robert Wyllie & my
 son in law Alexander McKibben & likewise my son
 Robert, and likewise it is my desire that my son
 John Gibson shall have that respective piece of land
 joining James Hood, Matthew Waller & the widow
 Waller only I reserve twenty poles along the open
 line with a straight corner to the ending corner of the
 entry if my said son should return here in the term of
 ten years if not I allow said land to my son William
 & further whoever of them my two sons John or
 William holds this land in Twelve years from this
 date shall pay my daughter Jane or her heirs forty
 dollars. Then It is my desire that my son William
 shall have all the remainder of my land with the
 waggon & farming tools of every kind with all the
 remainder of my stock of every kind with a bed &
 furniture & one third of my kitchen furniture—
 And I do hereby constitute & appoint my wife Eliza
 & my two sons Robert & William to be my sole executors
 to this my last will & Testament, disannulling all and
 every other former Will, Testaments & Legacies by me made
 written & by me attested before, Ratifying & confirming this
 & no other to be my last Will & Testament, in witness
 whereof I the said John Wyllie has hereunto set his
 hand & affixed his seal This 27th day of December 1806
