In the name of God Amen. I Joseph Bradley of Mecklenburg
County North Carolina being in the full & of his perfect mind
& memory thoughts being on God: Calling to mind the
mortality of my body & knowing that is of God, he all
now once to die, do make & declare this my last will and
Testament that is to say principally, I first of all, I give to
recommend my soul unto the Lord of God that gave it to
my body I recommend to the faith to be buried in a decent
Christian Burial at the discretion of my Executors with
standing that at the General resurrection I shall
receive the same again by the mighty power of God -
And as touching such worldly estate & with it as
pleased God to bless me in this life, I give, devise & bequeath
of the same in the following manner - I give
& bequeath to Joseph Bradley my dearly beloved
Daughter all my moveable Estate, Notifying & confirming
that & no other to be my last will & Testament. In Witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the 22^d day of
May in the year of our Lord one thousand seven

hundred & seventy eight - - 1778

In the name of God amen I John Barnwell of Mecklenburg
County & State of North Carolina, being weak of body but sound of
mind & memory blessed be God, On the 27th day of July in the
year of our Lord 1806 and of the 27th of the American Independance
make & declare this my last Will & Testament, disannulling &
disattorning all other wills or Wills by me heretofore made in
any wise whatever, and do now dispose of my property in
the following manner that is to say

Item 1st It is my will & desire & I do hereby leave my negro woman
Mary to be sold to the highest bidder and one hundred Dollars of
her price to be equally divided between Samuel Elliott's children
that he now has by his wife & then to wit Thomas Elliott, John El-
liott, Martha Elliott, Elvira Elliott, Robert Elliott, Polly Elliott, Eliza
Elliott, Susannah Elliott & Samuel Harvey Elliott, and the balance
of said Mary's price in like manner to be equally divided between
John Barnwell's children that he now has or may have by his
wife Susannah that now he has -

Item 2nd I give & bequeath to my son Mr. Barnwell all my wearing apparel
except my big coat which I give to my grand son John Elliott -
Item I give to my daughter Mary back wife of John back ten silver
Dollars to her & her heirs forever -

Item I give to my daughter Ann Elliott two feather beds & all the
furniture in them belonging with bedsteads & the heirs forever

I give & bequeath to my son John Barnwell one negro man named Darry
