memory, as to my worldly estate, I do hereby & in my last Will  
my wife shall have her choice of any of the three bedsteads  
bed & all its respective furniture with her cloathing & Bag  
horse & saddle & spinning wheel the negroes as entitled viz  
a certain negro boy named chace to my wife Jean To my so  
learest a negro boy called peet, To my Daughter Esther  
the old negro woman named Sarah - To my son John a  
negro girl call'd Rachels. The remainder of my personal  
property to be sold by vendor to defray my just debts  
and what remains to be equally divided between my  
wife & children. The children when capable to be school  
y provided with necessary cloathing, and if the children  
continue with my wife during her widowhood or  
until they are of age the benefit of the old master who  
is to go to their support. The land to be sold by vendor &  
the money arising therefrom to be equally divided as the  
other personal property before mentioned, and I also  
empower my executors to make a title in fee simple, by  
the same, and I likewise allow my sons if spared until  
they are fifteen years of age to be put to such trade, art.  
my choice — and I do constitute and appoint  
John Ch'Dow & William Patterson executors of this my  
last Will & Testament in behalf of my wife & children  
In witness whereof I do hereunto set my hand & seal  
This 10<sup>th</sup> day of October 1790.
