Money or the value thereof in property — 2^d I give & bequeath to
my six daughters Elizabeth Smith, Jessie Cunningham,
Lucy Boyd, Dolly Coffey, Patsy Darrell & Hannah Persons.
Twenty shillings each or the value thereof in property —

3^r I give & bequeath to my daughter Winfred Smith one negro woman
named Kizzy & one negro child named Aboda said negro now in her
the said Winfred Smiths possession — 4^t I give & bequeath to my son
Joseph A Darrell one negro boy now in his possession named Tom
5th I give & bequeath to my son John Darrell one platter bed and
furniture — 6th I give & bequeath to my son Williams Darrell one
Horse creature the choice of my Stock & one further bed & furniture
the above property as is settled that is not divided I wish to be
divided at my death 7th The plantation known by the
name of Ridgewood to my beloved wife Winfred Darrell dur
ing her life for her my beloved wife less than even only during
her life after her my wifes death I will & desire the said
plantation to my son John & Williams Darrell to be
equally divided between them I also leave or bind to my wife
two negro boys now known & called Tom & Edmon during her life after
her my beloved wifes death I give & bequeath the one named
Tom to my son John Darrell & the other named Edmon I give
& bequeath to my son Williams Darrell after my wifes death
And lastly I give & bequeath to my beloved wife Winfred
Darrell five Negroes known as Mr. & Mrs. Sandy, Dave, Jerry
& Rebecca & the whole of my Stock consisting of Horses, hogs, cows,
sheep & together with the whole of my Crop & in general all
the rest residue & remainder of my property of what kind so
ever nature scarce for her use & disposal — I also nominate &
appoint Benjamin Persons of the district of York & State of Pa

Minnow & soon following my death I will all my just debts deducted
I give & bequeath to my son Joseph Darnell Thence, Shillings in
Money or the Value thereof in property - 2dly I give & bequeath to
my six daughters Elizabeth Smith, Jenny Canningham,
Suey Boyd, Dolly Coffey, Patsy Darnell & Hannah Persons.
Twenty Shillings each or the Value thereof in property -
3rdly I give & bequeath to my Daughter Winfred Smith one Negroe woman
named Kizzy Home 1 negro child named Aboda said Negroe now in her
the said Winfred Smiths possession - 4thly I give & bequeath to my son
Joseph A Darnell one Negro boy now in his possession named Jim
5thly I give & bequeath to my son John Darnell one feather bed and
furniture - 6thly I give & bequeath to my son William Darnell one
Horse creature the choice of my Stock Home feather bed & furniture
the above property as I will that is not divided I wish to be
divided at my death 7thly the plantation I now live on
I leave or rather bequeath to my beloved wife Winfred Darnell dur-
ing her life for her my beloved wife less than one half during
her life, after her my wifes death I will & desire the said
plantation to my two sons John & William Darnell to be
equally divided between them. I also leave or bequeath to my wife
two Negro boys nam. Tom & Adam during her life after
her my beloved wifes death I give & bequeath the one second
time to my son John Darnell & the other second half and I give
& bequeath to my son William Darnell after my wifes death
and lastly I give & bequeath to my beloved wife Winfred
Darnell five Negroe to wit N. d. Sandy, Dace, Jenny
& Rebecca & the whole of my Stock consisting of Horses, hogs, cows,
sheep & together with the whole of my Crop & in general all
the rest residue & remainder of my property of what kind so-
ever & ever, or her use & disposition. I also nominate &
appoint Benjamin Persons of the district of York & State of Pa.
witnessing & my beloved wife Winfred Darnell sole Executrix &
Administrator of this my last Will & Testament hereby revoking
all former Wills by me made in writing wherof there
remains to set my hand and seal this 1st 11th day

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of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
hundred and twelve — August 12th 1812 —

who have hereunto subscribed our
names as witnesses

of Hertford being & State of North Carolina, being very sick & weak
in body but of perfect mind & memory thanks be given unto
God, calling unto mind the mortality of my body & knowing
that it is appointed unto all men once to die. Do make this
I declare in this my last will & testament that is to say prior
especially & first of all. I give & recommend my soul unto God
that gave it, my body I recommend to the earth to be buried
in a decent Christian burial at the discretion of Executors
not being doubtful but at the general resurrection I shall
receive the same again by the mighty power of God —
and as touching such worldly estate wherewithal it has
pleased God to bless me in this life I give devise & dispose
of the same in the following manner & form — First I give
the greatest to my lawful & only beloved wife former Dame for
love & good will & affection I have to her this plantation
I now live on, likewise all that is thereon that is the house
of horses, cattle & also all the household & kitchen furniture
with all the farming utensils, likewise the benefit of my
two negroes that is a boy called Ned & girl called Bett for to
support the family during her lifetime or widowhood
excepting the under named Legacies — Also I give unto my
dear beloved children Maria Eliza & Darnell the plantation
intact & unbroken land for to have the benefit of the same, but
if it is given as he arrives to the age of twenty one years
of age his mother to have the benefit of the same during his
lifetime or if she should marry before he arrives to
