& memory, but in a low state of health, & calling to mind that it is ap-
pointed for all men once to die. Do make & ordain this my last will
& Testament, and in the first place I do commit my soul into the
hands of God that gave it, in expectation of a glorious resurrec-
tion at the great day of Judgment. As to my body I commit it
to the dust from whence it was taken to be buried at the
discretion of my executors hereafter named in Christian maner.
Item. It is my will that my beloved wife charged her bed & furniture saddle
&рин wheel & half an acre of flax & all her apparel & two Peacock
Dishes & a pair of plates & one Basin.

Item. It is my will & pleasure to give & bequeath next. my son Joseph
Elliott all my weareing apparel & tract or part of land lying
in South Carolina on Bullards creek containing, one hundred
fifty acres of the said plantation and so to be divided by my
executors at publick Vendue & all the rest of my moveable
property & then to be divided into three equal parts to be then
to be given to my beloved wife charged & the other two parts
to be given to my son Joseph after paying all my just Debts out
of the money arising out of the said sale.

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I Robert Elliott of the County of Rockingham in the State of
North Carolina Farmer being weak in body but perfectly sound
in mind & memory do make & ordain the following & no other
to be my last will and testament.

1st It is my will & desire that all my just debts shall be paid out of
my estate: — 2^d It is my will & bequeath to my wife Martha my
Negro woman Cherry & herby direct that a sum of the price
of eighty Dollars be purchased out of my estate which may with
her saddle & bridle & one feather. — 3^d It is my will that the plan-
tation on which I live shall be sold at publick sale to the highest
bidder and that part of the price thereof be applied to purchasing
an acre of less value for my wife & family to live upon which
place for the use of my family generally during the time
they live together, and I do hereby authorize & empower my
executors herein named to make a sufficient title in full
simple for my said plantation to the purchaser of all the
right title & interest I have in the same.

2^d I desire that my boy tell all the small negroes all my
stock of Cattle hogs & sheep be kept for the use of my family
& that the residue of my horses & such articles as can be spared
from the familys use be sold, I desire that my wife & family
live together during her widowhood and at the time my oldest
child comes of age that a distribution of all the estate then on
hand & not herein before mentioned shall be divided as equal as possle
