my last Will & Testament, having recd my making & making well & valid  
all other Wills & Testaments whatsoever by me heretofore made and  
done - In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this  
20th day of November 1806 - Signed, sealed, published, pronounced  
declared to be my last Will & Testament in presence of the under  
named subscribing witnesses

The last Will & Testament of Josiah Harris

In the name of God Lamen. I Josiah Harris of Kirkland County  
State of Colarolina. Being thro' the plentous mercy & goodness  
of God. tho' weak in body. yet of a sound & perfect understand-  
ing & memory. Do constitute. This my last Will & Testament and  
desire it may be received by all as such: first I most heartily  
recommend my soul to God my maker beseeching his most  
gracious acceptance of it. thro' the all sufficient merit &  
intercession of my most compassionate Redeemer Jesus Christ  
who gave himself to be an ransom for my sins His al-  
l grace to the uttermost all that come unto God by him

being he will liveth to make intercession for them, & who I  
trust will not reject me a returning penitent sinner when  
I come to him for mercy in this hope & confidence I rendevous  
my soul with comfort, humbly beseeching the most blessed  
Trinitarian Trinity one God Most Holy most Merciful & gracious  
to prepare me for the time of my dissolution & then to take me  
to himself into that peace trust & incomparable felicity  
which he has purchased for them that love & fear his Holy  
name, Amen blessed be God. I give my body to the earth from  
whence it came in full assurance of its resurrection from  
thence at the last day, as for my burial I desire it may  
be decent without pomp or state at the discretion of my  
executors here after named who I doubt not will manage  
it with prudence. As to my worldly estate I will opportunity  
order that all my debts be paid. First I bequeath to my  
daughter Louisa Sixty dollars, to my son Samuel fifty dollars  
and my land to be divided quantity & quality between  
my sons John Cram & Greenwich beginning on Waller Davis  
line & running to the Indian line including the Indian  
land. John Cram to have the South side Greenwich the North  
side, I bequeath to Greenwich a Negro boy named Bailey & a horse  
worth Sixty dollars. I bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Adams  
Two negro Girls viz Lucy & Miller and a horse & cow worth Sixty dollars  
Two cows & calves her own bed & furniture, I bequeath to my  
daughter Mary and Hyatt two negro girls viz Phoebe & Rachel in her  
worth Sixty dollars & a new saddle worth Sixteen dollars, two cows  
& calves, her bed & furniture, I leave four hundred dollars for the  
support of my daughter Esther to be managed at the discretion  
of my executors, I bequeath to my three sons each of them a Bed  
& Furniture, the balance of the House & Kitchen furniture to be equally  
divided between Elizabeth & Margaret, the rest of my estate if any  
to be equally divided among my six children. In witness whereof I do hereby  
institute my sons Edmund & John Cram executors of this my  
last Will & Testament. I do witness whereof I have hereunto set  
my hand & seal this

order that all my debts be paid. First I bequeath to my

line & running to the Indian line including the Indian  
land. John Green to have the South side. Jeremiah the North  
side. I bequeath to Jeremiah a Negro boy named Beck & a horse  
worth sixty dollars. I bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Adams  
two Negro girls viz Lucy & Miller and a horse worth sixty dollars  
& two cows & calves her own bed & furniture. I bequeath to my  
daughter ~~Elizabeth~~ <sup>Hannah</sup> two Negro girls viz Phoebe & Rachel each horse  
worth forty dollars & a mule saddle worth sixteen dollars, two cows  
& calves, her bed & furniture. I leave four hundred dollars for the  
support of my daughter Esther to be managed at the discretion  
of my executors. I bequeath to my three sons each of them a bed  
& furniture. The balance of the house & kitchen for return to be equally  
divided between Elizabeth & Margaret, the rest of my estate if any  
to be equally divided among my six children. In witness of this my  
last Will & Testament. I the witness whereof I have written to me  
my hand & seal this
