

In the Name of God Amen. 13th day of May 1771. I Joseph Kerr of North
Carolina & County of New Hanover, having in perfect health mind and
memory, but about to take a long journey thanks be to God for it, therefore
calling to mind the Mortality of my body & knowing that it is ap-
pointed for all men once to die, Do make & ordain this my last will
& Testament, that whereby principally & first of all, I give & recommend
my soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it & my Body I
recommend to the Earth to be buried in a decent Christian burial
at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at the
general Resurrection I shall receive the same body again by the
mighty power of God; and as touching such worldly estate as I have with
it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life, I give, devise & dispose
of the same in the following manner & upon these conditions. I give and
bequeath to Elizabeth my dearly & well beloved wife the third part of
my whole Estate after all my just debts are paid.

Then I give & bequeath to my son Joseph seven & six pence.
Also, And the rest of my Estate I leave to be equally divided between
my two daughters Ambeth Brook & Elizabeth Parker till they should
die before their husband & it is to go to the Heirs of their bodies -
Also, I give & bequeath to my son Williams Children, friend & his ty
pounds twelve shillings that is due to me from his Estate.

I likewise constitute make & declare Williams above named blacksmith
& Ambeth above named, legatee to be my sole Executrix of this my last
will & Testament. Till it is put in my hands Testamente & Remonstrance
by me proposed & required, and I do hereby utterly disallow, revoke
& disannul all former other former Testaments, Wills, Legacies, &
bequests, & Administrations, one in any wise before named, revoked and
disannulled. Utzify day & year preceding this & no other to be my last
will & Testament. In witness whereof I hereunto set my hand
that the day & year above written.
