of Newbury County being very sick & weak in body, but of perfect  
mind & memory thank be given unto God therefore, calling unto mind the  
mortality of my body & knowing that it is appointed to all men once to  
die, do make & declare this my last will & testament, that is to say  
Principally & first of all I give & recommend my soul unto the hand of  
Almighty God that gave it, & my body I recommend to the earth to be  
buried in a decent Christian burial at the discretion of my executors  
nothing obstructing but at the general Resurrection I shall receive the  
same again by the mighty power of God, and as touching such worldly  
estate whatsoever it has pleased God to bestow in this life I give & leave  
the same of the same in the following manner & form First I give &  
bequeath the sum one hundred dollars to my wife to have & to maintain  
out of her estate I now have at present, the choice of any of the best, that  
she thinks proper as long as she lives & the rest I leave to my son Joseph  
said Joseph to take care of his mother while she is alive except one  
lens & half. Also leave one hundred to my daughter Barn Lemon, also to my  
son my well beloved son whom I therefore constitute make & ordain  
my sole Executrix of this my last will & testament. And I do hereby utterly  
disavow, Rebuke & disown all & every other former testament, will,  
Poyntis, legacies Executed by me in any wise before record, will'd &  
begun & left, Ratifying & Confirming this & no other to be my last will &  
testament the witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the  
day & year above written . . . Signed sealed published pronounced and  
delivered to the said Joseph Moore as his last will & testament in the  
presence of us the subscribers witness present
