think proper to settle & dispose of such worldly Estate
as it hath pleased a beautiful Providence to bless me
with in this life in manner & form following Viz
Imprimis I will that all my lawful debts be discharged out
of my Estate. Item I will & bequeath to my beloved wife
Margaret Richert my negro girl named Fan, all my
Stock of Horses & Cattle, all my beds & covering with every
article of Household & Kitchen furniture to be her
property during life & at her death to be disposed at her death
also the whole use property & benefits of the house & lot
on which I live & the lot on the South side of Tryon
Street N^o 64 during her life & after her death to be dis-
posed as hereafter mentioned & further that all
monies on hand & all outstanding debts be appropriated

to her use & at her discretion, Item I will & request that all my other property whether real or personal not heretofore mentioned, of which I do expect be said by my Executors & the manner arising therefrom be divided in three equal shares or parts one of which I bequeath to the Children of my daughter Mary Coburn who was wife to James Coburn a second part I bequeath to Margaret McComb my second Daughter & wife of Robert McComb, The third & last part I bequeath to my youngest daughter Elizabeth Hapley who was first wife to Henry de V. now to said husband. Item It is my will & request that after the death of my beloved wife — Margaret Wiskent the said three lots above mentioned be occupied by her surviving life, that they be then sold & the profits arising therefrom, be divided into three equal shares & appropriated to & delivered to the Children of Mary Coburn & to Margaret McComb & Elizabeth Wilson in like manner as above mentioned. Lastly I hereby constitute & appoint my beloved wife Margaret Wiskent & Thomas Henderson Executors & Executor of this my last will & Testament, hereby revoking all other Wills made or to be made by me heretofore in anywise.
