In the name of God Amen. This 5th day of March
in the year of our Lord 1844 I Kitchin Peab of the County of
Hutchinson in the State of N^o Carolina, being sick & weak in years
& calling to mind my mortality & that it is appointed for all men
to die Do make this my last will & Testament, First of recommending
my soul to God who gave it, my body to the earth to be buried in
a decent manner, And as to my worldly estate it is my will & desire
that all my just debts & funeral expenses be paid & satisfied by my
executors hereafter named - 2^d I give & bequeath to my wife my
dwelling house with all the furniture thereon & the plantation on
which said house stands with stock of every kind during her life
or widow or at least until my son John comes to the age of twenty
one years, And it is my will & I order that all things be kept together
for the use of said family until the said John arrives to the above
mentioned age, then all movable property be, not to sell & equally
divided between my wife the above named John, Gordon & Elizabeth
excepting what money will be hereafter mentioned, I give & bequeath
to my son John when he arrives to mature age of 21 years the
plantation on which I now live containing 123 acres or more with
appurtenances with the ~~same~~ following negroes our black named Mary our
son named Long our black named Ned to whom his head & apparel, I give &
bequeath to Thomas & Abram twenty shillings each to be
paid to me by my estate due. And to the above division

and for the true execution of this my last will & Testament I
 appoint John Wynn & Sarah Hentrich my executors, hereby
 revoking & disannulling all other wills & bequests by me heretofore
 made, Relieving & confirming this & no other to be my last will &
 Testament, Signed, Sealed, Published & declared by the said
 Nathan Peim as his last will & Testament in presence of

In the name of God Amen. 17th day of August
 1804 I William Porter near Fleets creek in Cheselburg
 County I hereby call to mind the mortality of my body
 & that is appointed for all men once to die, Do make & declare
 this my last will & Testament, That is to say, first of all
 I commend my soul into the hands of God that gave it me not
 doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall receive the
 same again by the mighty Power of God, & my body to be
 buried in a Christian & decent manner at the discretion of my
 executors, and as concerning such worldly estate as it hath pleased
 God to bless me with, I leave & bequeath in the following
 manner & manner; That is to say, I leave & bequeath to my son
Elizabeth the second best Horse or mare that I die possessed
 of, also I leave as a legacy to Elizabeth a saddle gown, and to
 my Pollycott & a pair of Slays, and I leave to my son William
 daughter Elizabeth a saddle gown, & to my son William I
 leave the plantation which I now live on with that part
 lately purchased, from old William DeGraham to enjoy both
 which as long as he live at his death I wish to fall to his sons
 be they many or few & if he have no sons, then they fall to his
 daughter & if he have no child then I wish to fall to his
 nearest blood relation in that case I address said lands to my son
 & daughter & daughter Elizabeth & Elizabeth, and if my
 son William takes a thought of moving from this place I then
 wish to be buried in the land as he thinks
