In the name of God Amen. This 5th day of March in the year of our Lord 1804 I Mitchell Peab of the County of Westchester in the State of New York being sick & weak in years & calling to mind my mortality & that it is appointed for all men to die Do make this my last will & Testament, First of recommending my soul to God who gave it, my body to the earth to be buried in a decent manner, last as to my worldly estate it is my will & desire that all my just debts & several expenses be paid & satisfied by my Executors hereafter named - 2nd I give & bequeath to my wife my dwelling house with all the furniture thereon & the plantation on which said house stands with stock of every kind during her life & widowhood or at least until my son John comes to the age of twenty one year, and it is my will & I order that all things be kept together for the use of said family until the said John arrives to the above mentioned age, then all movable property be, not to be & equally divided between my wife the above named John, Gordon & Elizabeth excepting what money will be hereafter mentioned, I give & bequeath to my son John when he arrives to mature age of 21 years the plantation on which I now live containing 123 acres more or less with ag. gear with the in following negroes our watch named Wesley our dog named Long our watch named Net to have his heed & officers, James & George to Thomas & Abraham twenty shillings each to be paid out of my Estate due due to the above division.

and for the true execution of this my last will & Testament I
do not join with and I do not intend to be my executor, hereby
revoking & disannulling all other wills & bequests, by me heretofore
made, Relieving & confirming this & no other to be my last will &
testament, Legons, Sealed, Pronounced & declared by the Justice
of the Peace as his last will & Testament in presence of
my witnesses

1804 I William Porter near Stevi creek in Shenandoah
County I hereby do call to mind the mortality of my body
& that is appointed for all men once to die, Do make & declare
this my last will & Testament, That is to say, first of all
I commend my soul into the hands of God that gave it me not
desiring but at the general Resurrection I shall receive the
same again by the mighty Power of God, & my body to be
buried in a Christian & decent manner at the discretion of my
executors, and as concerning such worldly estate as it hath pleased
God to bless me with, I leave & bequeath in the following
manner & form; That is to say, I leave & bequeath to my son
Abraham the seven best Horses or more that I die possessed
of, also a pair of silver Elizabeth a saddle gown, and to
my Pollycott & a pair of Slays, and I leave to my son William
daughter Elizabeth a saddle gown, & to my son William I
leave the plantation which I now live on with that part
belonging thereto, from old William DeGraham to enjoy both
whilst he liveth but at his death to be divided to fall to his sons
be they many or few & if he have no sons, then they fall to his
daughters & if he should die having neither son or daughter
living then in that case I should have to be divided to my son
& daughter & daughter viz James & Elizabeth, and if my
son William takes a thought of moving from this place I shall
give all the money & the possession of the land as he thinks
