will & I do Order that all my just debts & funeral charges
be paid. - 2^d It is my will & I do Order that my beloved wife Priscilla
have one hundred & ten acres of Land including the dwelling house
the same being the part of my tract of Land that was conveyed to
her & which she commonly called the home lot during her life, which
land at her decease shall descend to my youngest daughter
Priscilla. I do further give & bequeath to my beloved wife Priscilla
my negro boy named Richard Franklin, also all the household &
kitchen furniture (except one bed & furniture) to be hers and at
her own disposal, Also my Dear Horse
3^d It is my will & I do Order that my daughter Amine have one
hundred acres of Land lying in the south east corner of my Land marked
in the plat of division of my Land. 4th It is my will & I do Order
that the Heirs of my daughter Sally Shivers & Decies have one hundred
acres of Land lying North of Amine's & West of the home lot marked in
plat of division No 2 - 5th It is my will & I do Order that my son
John Jellon have one hundred acres of Land lying north of the lot

And as for the heirs of Sally, marked in plat No 3
 It is my will & I do order that my daughter Chazy Giltham have
 one hundred acres of Land lying north of John L's lot marked
 & laid down in plat No 4 The above devised lands to be as here
 by me surveyed & laid off in the general plat of Division & single
 plots marked & numbered by John M'Neven be the same more or less
 It is my will & I do order that my daughter Priscilla have one
 third & furniture --- 8th It is my will & I order that all the remainder
 of my Estate both real & personal be sold & the proceeds be equally
 divided to my beloved wife Priscilla my two sons & daughters
 namely Elizabeth, Semina, Chazy, Sally's Heirs one part & Priscilla
 John L, James L, Alexander B, Asaph & Isaac G. Jellison It being
 expressly understood that all receipts heretofore or that may
 hereafter be given by any of the above named legacies for any pro-
 perty at a certain valuation or money as part of my Estate be
 considered & accounted as proceeds of sale & division made Read-
 ily Disallowing all former Wills, Legacies & Executions, Ordains
 & allowing by these presents my beloved wife Priscilla with my sons
 Alexander B. Jellison & Francis Becky to be my Joint Executors of
