of life, Do make this instrument of writing my last will & testa-

be paid. - 2^d It is my will & I do order that my beloved wife Priscilla
have one hundred acres of land including the dwelling house
the same being the best of my tract of land that was surveyed the
most valuable commonly called the home lot during his life, which
land at her decease shall descend to my youngest daughter
Priscilla & do further give & bequeath to my beloved wife Priscilla
my negro boy named Richard Franklin, also all the household &
kitchen furniture (except one bed & matress) to be hers and at
her own disposal, Also my Deed Book

hundred acres of land lying in the south east corner of my lands marked
in the plat of division of my lands No^o 4th 4th It is my will & I do order
that the heirs of my daughter Sally Franklin ~~Franklin~~ have one hundred
acres of land lying North of Amenia's tract the home lot marked in
plat of division No^o 2nd 5th It is my will & I do order that my son
John S. Jettion have one hundred acres of land lying north of the lot

as far the basis of Sally marked in plat No. 9.

It is my will & I do order that my daughter Mary Gilham have one hundred acres of Land lying North of plat No. 9 marked & laid down in plat No. 9. & the above described land to be as hereinafter described & laid off in the general plat of Division & single plats marked & numbered by estate in it. Reason being same more fully given below. It is my will & I do order that my daughter Priscilla have one hundred & four acres — 8th. It is my will & I order that all the remainder of my Estate both real & personal be sold & the proceeds be equally divided to my beloved wife priscilla my two sons & daughters namely Elizabeth, Jerome, Mary, Sally & their joint & Priscilla John S. James S. Alexander B. Joseph & Isaac J. Fenton & it being expressly understood that all receipts heretofore or thence may now after be given by any of the above named legatees for any purpose, at a certain valuation or money aspect of my Estate be considered & accounted as proceed of sale & division made accordingly. Disallowing all former Wills, Legacies & Executions, Ordering & Directing by these presents, my beloved wife Priscilla with my sons Alexander B. Fenton & Francis Beck to be my Joint Executors of this my last Will & Testament. In witness whereof I have set my hand & seal this 11th day of September in the year of our Lord 1826.
