I Margaret Day, wife being in health and sound mind & memory, do make
& declare this my last Will & Testament, I follow my Executors to bury
my body in a decent Christian manner: 2^d I follow as my just debts
to be paid: 3^d I give to my son Thomas Dayless ten Shillings
4th I give to my Daughter Margaret &anson my Riding habit & one half
of my household & kitchen furniture worth one hundred & eighty Dollars
5th I give to my Daughter Jennett & Lewis my mare & the other half of my
household & kitchen furniture: 6th I give to my grand daughter Peggy Dayless
daughter of my son George Dayless one cow & half third he has now in his
possession: 7th I give to my son Joseph Dayless the rest of my Cattle also
I allow my son Joseph to sell my love my mare & molly at a twelve
months Credit, and pay the one hundred & eighty Dollars that is owing
to my Daughter Margaret &anson. And the remainder I allow him
to keep, the one half the other half to be equally divided between my
son George Dayless & my Daughter Jennett & Lewis.

Also I constitute & appoint my son Joseph Douglass Executor of this
my last will & Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand & seal this day & year above written.

I bequeath to my brother's children Daniel Deherty to Rebecca
fifty Dollars. I bequeath to his daughter Elizabeth Deherty one
black mare. To his daughter Hannah Deherty one bay horse
To his daughter Elanor Deherty one lot of said black mare
I bequeath to my brother Daniel Deherty all the rest of my estate
real & personal. I also appoint my brother Daniel Deherty
Executor of this my last will & Testament. In Witness I have
