North Carolina Mecklenburg County. Done the 2<sup>d</sup> 1818  
I chargt Day, less being in health and sound mind & memory, to make & declare this my last will & Testament, 1<sup>st</sup> I give to my Executor to bury my body in a decent Christian manner 2<sup>d</sup> I leave my just debts to be paid. 3<sup>rd</sup> I give to my son Thomas Douglass Ten Shillings 4<sup>th</sup> I give to my Daughter Margaret Blanson my Riding Chair & one half of my household & kitchen furniture worth one hundred & Eighty Dollars 5<sup>th</sup> I give to my Daughter Jemima Pleasant my House & the other half of my household & kitchen furniture 6<sup>th</sup> I give to my grand daughter Peggy Douglass daughter of my son George Douglass one boar & half the rest he has now in his possession 7<sup>th</sup> I give to my son Joseph Douglass the rest of my cattle also I allow my son Joseph to sell my two negroes Name & Mitty at a fair price Credit, and paying the One hundred & Eighty Dollars that is left to my Daughter Margaret Blanson, and the remainder I allow him to keep the one half the other half to be equally divided between my son George Douglass & my Daughter Jemima & herself
