the mighty power of the Lord! And as touching such worldly
things as it has pleased God to bless me with I give devise
in the manner & form following; And first it is my will
that all my funeral expenses & just debts be paid
Item 1st I will to William Bigelow that now lives with me
my Cupboard & one bed & furniture that he now claims w/
a black Turkey clad & my large Bible & my pincions & one
pewter dish marked A.B. & half dozen pewter plates & one
small pewter Basin. - Item 2^d I will to C. H. Bigelow
daughter of William Bigelow of Lincoln County my bed &
bedstead & furniture & one celico quilt. Item 3^d I will
to Nancy Bigelow daughter of William Bigelow of
Lincoln County my largest pewter Basin
Item 4th I will to Mary Nelson that now lives with me
if she continues to live with me to my pleasure my other
bed & bedstead & furniture & black mare & one Heifer that
she now claims & one iron chest pincions & one buffet pot
& six dollars in money & coffee mill & two tin cans & one
black counterpan. - Item 5th I will to Sally Brown

black silk handkerchief one pair of black silk Gloves
& one lace Cap - Item 9th I Will my sister Jane Nelson
my new Spotted calico gown & the rest of my everyday
clothes - Item 10th I will to Margaret Patterson my oldest
calico bag quilt - Item 11th I will to Sally A. Sloan my
small Tea cups & Tea pot & to Peggy Sloan one punch
bowl & to Loren Sloan one candlestick & to my sister in law
Anna Sloan my bonnet & one pair of cotton gloves - to
Aurtha Sloan my bread server & all the rest of my property
be sold on a credit of twelve months & equally divided
between William Bigham of Lincoln County & William
Graham that lives with me, Rebekah Whiteside, Jane
Nelson, Margaret Patterson & Robert Sloan with four
dollars out of the same to Margaret McGehee -
And lastly I instructe Belain & appoint William
Bigham of Lincoln County & Robert Sloan Executors
of this my last will & Testament - signed Sealed &
