 to die, do make & give in this my last will & testament
 that is to say principally & first of all I give my soul
 unto the hand of God that gains it, & my body I
 recommend to the Earth to be buried in a decent man-
 ner at the discretion of my executors, and as touching
 such worldly estate as it hath pleased God to bless
 me with in this life I give & dispose of the same
 in the manner & form viz I give & bequeath to my
 beloved son Joseph Jackson two dollars if he comes
 to receive it in the space of two years if not to fall
 to my grand niece Margret Wilson, I give and
 bequeath to my grand niece Margret Wilson
 two half soas & three guineas & half an Moidore
 also my bed & furniture & all my lady clothing &
 also a peaster four dishes & three basons & half dozen of plates
 four basins & forks, one bust, one spinning wheel & Swift,
 one Gadding & Silver Claps & Box iron & complete books
 Vlack & one Hatch & one gridole - And I hereby
 nominate & appoint William Wilson and
Matthew Wilson to be my sole executors of this my
 last will & testament, and I do hereby revoke and
 disannul all & every other former wills Testa-
 ments, Legacies & executors by me in any wise made
 willed or bequeathed before, and I do testify this
 & no other to be my last will & testament - In testi-
 mony whereof I the said Margaret Wilson have signed
