

In the name of God Amen, I Margaret Wilson of the State
of N^o Carolina & County of Beaufort, enjoying comfort-
able health of body & of sound mind & memory (as I feel
God for his mercies) publish this my last will & testament
in manner & form as followeth; First of all I commend
my soul to Almighty God not out of fear, but,
sincerely trusting that it may be received in mercy by
him abounding through Jesus Christ; and my body
I commit to the dust to be buried in a decent manner
and as touching my worldly Estate I dispose of it in
the following manner, My will is that my son James
have & hold the new survey of land lying up the
branch on which I live containing about fifty acres
& bounded by the line of Matthew Wallis & the land
of Joseph, provided he pay to my son Elias the
sum of Fifty dollars upon the completion of the
redemption of the above land to be the interest for forty
of him viz James & his heirs forever and whereas
a doubt arises in my own mind whether or not I
have a right to divide the old original tract on which
I now live, provided therefore it should be forborne
in law or otherwise that I had a right to divide said
land to prevent all contention. My will is that
my son Elias have & hold the one third part of the
old original survey on which I live according to the
allotment a bargain which he made with my son
John & this third part to be in plan & form as has been
heretofore understood. And as my son James is parted
from my daughter Deborah all the interest she might
have in said land, my will is therefore that my son
James have & hold in fee simple the remaining
two thirds of the old original survey on which I live
Let it be understood that all of the above divisions

of land are made to the use of the said & assigns forever
 My further will is that my daughter Polly shall have my
 negro child Mary & that she should said Mary live to
 have children that her first child to the property of
Peggy the eldest daughter of said Polly & that Mary
 be never sold but she & her issue be & remain. The pro-
 perty of said Polly & her descendants in a regular
 succession forever; My further will is that my daugh-
 -ter Ann Alexander have & hold my negro child Ophe
 & should she live to have issue, that her eldest child
 be the property of my Grand daughter Peggy daughter
 of said Ann & that said Sophia be never sold but
 her & her descendants be the property of said Ann & her
 regular descendants forever - My further will is
 that my children John, James & Deborah have an
 equal & joint property in my negro woman Rachel
 & in case said Rachel should any more children
 that the first be property of James; My further
 will is that my son Elias have the prime of the
 house cloth which I sold him & which now lies
 in his hands; My further will is that my wearing
 apparel & stuff furniture be equally divided
 among my three daughters; My further will is that
John & Deborah have each a bed & furniture & a cow
 a piece; My further will is that my Grand daughter
Peggy daughter of Deborah have a horse & saddle & whip
 & I do hereby appoint my three sons Elias, John &
James Executors (if need be of Executors) of this my last
 will & Testament Published the 22nd April 1802
 containing three pages & a few lines.

In the name of God Amen. I Peter Hynnes of Westchester
 County in the province of N. Carolina being weak of body
 but of perfect mind & memory, calling to my mind the mor-
 tality of my body, as it is appointed for all men once to die
 I do therefore make this my last will & Testament. Inprimis
 I order my body to be decently buried & all funeral expen-
 ses to be paid & all my just debts to be paid. Item I be-
 queath to my beloved wife Elizabeth Hynnes one
 black mare about five years old & her riding saddle
 & one bed & furniture ^{she is full of the dropsy & consumption} & I bequeath to her during her
 natural life my negro kench named Stom I be-
 queath to my little children John Springs Hynnes
 & Peggy Abel Hynnes & Polly Springs Hynnes & Allen
Hynnes & William Hynnes all the share that proceeds
 from the above named negro kench & her which she
 bequeath she remains in the possession of Elizabeth my
 wife to be equally divided among my above named
 little children Stom I bequeath to Elizabeth
 my beloved wife the plantation & improvements there-
 on which she has at our hand. Stom It is my will & desire that
 my three sons John Springs Hynnes & Allen Hynnes & William
Hynnes when they arrive to a sufficient age to be put
 to some good trade — Lastly I will & desire consti-
 tute, appoint & declare Nathaniel Alexander to
