rational health of body & of sound mind from my (n.s.) & the
God for his mercy publish this my last will & testament
in manner & form as follows:— First of all I commit
my soul to Almighty God not out of form, but,
sincerely trusting that it may be received in mercy by
him almighty through Jesus Christ; and my body
I commit to the dust to be buried in a decent manner
and as touching my worldly estate I dispose of it in
the following manner, my will is that my son James
have & hold the new survey of land lying east the
aboreach on which I have a surveying about fifty acres
it bounded by the lines of Matthew Willis' Ketherside
Capester, provided he pay to my son Elis the
sum of Fifty dollars & up on the completion with the
condition the above land to be the interest property
of him viz James & his heirs forever and whereas
a doubt arises in my own mind whether or not I
have a right to divide the old original tract in which
I now live, provided therefore it should be found
in law or otherwise that I had a right to divide said
land to prevent all contention. My will is that
my son Elias have & hold the one third part of the
old original survey on which I have according to the
aforesaid a bargain which he made with my son
John & this third part to be in place & form as has been
heretofore understood. And as my son James apprehended
from my daughter Deborah all the interest she might
have in said land, my will is therefore that my son
James have & hold in fee simple the remaining
two thirds of the old original survey on which being
let it be understood that all of the above division

of land are made with me their Husbands sonne
 My will is that my daughter Polly Shew & have my
 negro child Marjory & that she should said Marjory
 have children that her first Child to the property of
 Polly the odst daughter of said Polly & that P. Marjory
 be never sold but she & her issue be free men. The pro-
 perty of said Polly & her descendants in a regular
 succession forever. My further will is that my daugh-
 ter Anne Alexander & had my negro child Sophia
 & should she live to have issue, that his odst child
 be the property of my Grand daughter P. Marjory daughter
 of said Anne & that said Sophia be never sold but
 her & her descendants be the property of said Anne & her
 regular descendants forever - My further will is
 that my Children John, James & Deborah have an
 equal & joint property in my negro woman Rachel
 & in case said Rachel shoudl any more children
 that the first be property of James. My further
 will is that my son Ellis have the prie of the
 horse cloak which I sold him & which now lies
 in his hands. My further will is that my weareing
 apparel & stuff sometimes be equally divided
 among my three daughters. My further Will is that
 John & Deborah have each a bed & furniture & a Cow
 a pice; My further will is that my Grand daughter
 P. Marjory daughter of Deborah have a three year old Kippe
 which I do hereby appoint my three sons Ellis, John &
 James Executors (if need be of Executrix) of this my last
 will & Testament Published the 22nd April 1802
 containing three pages & a few lines.

In the name of God Amen. I Peter Myrons of Westovering County in the province of St. Barthelemy being weak of body but of perfect mind & memory, setting to my mind the mortality of my body, as it is appointed for all men once to die I do therefore make this my last will & Testament imprimis
I desire my body to be decently buried & interred & I desire
to be buried & all my just debts to be paid Item I bequeath
to my beloved wife Elizabeth Myrons one
black mare about four years old & her riding saddle
I am bid & sometimes ^{at the end of the day's labor} had I begun to take disease by
natural life my negro house maid Item this
I bequeath to my little children John Springs Myrons
& Peggy Att. Myrons & Polly Springs Myrons & Allen
Myrons & William Myrons all the sum that he stands
from the above named negro house maid while she
lives she remains in the possession of Elizabeth my
wife to be equally divided among my above named
little children Item I will & bequeath to Elizabeth
my beloved wife the plantation & improvements
standing her house & land. Item This my will & desire that
my three sons John P. Myrons & Allen Myrons & William
Myrons when they attain to a sufficient age to be put
to some good trade - Lastly I will make consti-

—tutes, appoint & certain Nathaniel Green the
