to him and his Heirs forever - 2<sup>d</sup> I wish my Son Henry  
H Glover to take the three little children of Lucy Smith  
if he the said <sup>Mecklenburg Co. NC Wills 1783-1844</sup> ~~Husband~~ <sup>is no longer necessary for these</sup>  
and keep and School them one year out of the labor time  
property after paying all my lawful debts - 3<sup>rd</sup> having  
but Little to will I have determined to leave it all to  
one child though at the same time having in Remembrance  
all the rest of my Children namely Matthew Marshall  
Jeddy Houston, William Glover, Barnes Glover, Benjamin  
Glover, Nancy Weathers and the above mentioned Wright  
Glover, John Glover & Joseph Glover and my deceased daughter  
Rebecca Smith the Mother of the three above mentioned little  
children

4<sup>th</sup> and Lastly I nominate and appoint my son Henry  
H Glover Executor to this my last will & Testament  
Truly reciting all former wills by me made before -

Mecklenburg and State of NC Carolina being in a pocketh of health  
but of sound mind & memory this 10<sup>th</sup> day of March in the year of  
our Lord 1826. Make publish and declare this my last will &  
testament in manner & form following viz.

I give & bequeath unto my wife Rebecca Kennedy one negro  
man named Andrew & one nego woman named Jessie & a girl  
youngest child named Harry to be herd forever, I also give my  
wife Rebecca the one half of the tract of Land I now live on  
for her to maintain my son David Kennedy & his wife David  
Kennedy lives longer than my wife Rebecca said negro & land  
shall be maintained & used David during his natural life &  
at death of said Rebecca & David said land to be the property of my  
third son Francis Kennedy & also give my wife Rebecca two horses  
her choice of my Stock &

I give & bequeath to my daughter Eliza McKenney one nego girl  
named Lucy born the 20<sup>th</sup> day of March 1783-1844  
with a saddle & bridle & Virginia pincers & a horse and one cow —

I give & bequeath unto my son Baron Kennedy one nego man  
named Nathan, and one horse named Broadway his saddle and bridle  
one bed & furniture and one cow —

I give & bequeath unto my son Francis Kennedy one half of the  
plantation I now live on leaving the house & improvements to  
eldest son for the use of my wife Rebecca & son David & his wife  
Dicks with one bed & furniture and one cow —

I give & bequeath unto my Daugt'r Agnes Kennedy one nego  
girl named Harriet one horse Saddle & Bridle one bed & furniture with one  
cow —

I give & bequeath unto my son Thomas Kennedy one nego boy  
named Samuel, one nego boy named Jacob & three hundred dollars  
in money & one horse Saddle & Bridle one bed & furniture with one  
cow — I give & bequeath unto my wife Rebecca Kennedy the remainder  
of my household & kitchen furniture, farming utensils and the  
remainder of my Stock of hosses Hogs & Sheep to be herd forever  
And I do my present estate disannul & make void all former

testament to my manners & form following viz.

Item I give & bequeath unto my wife Rebecca Kennedy one negro boy named Samuels & one negro woman named Sally & fully youngest child named Harry to be hers forever, I also give my wife Rebecca the one half of the tract of land I now live on for her to sustain my son David Kennedy & his said David Kennedy lives longer than my wife Rebecca said negro & land shall be maintained with David during his natural life & at the death of said Rebecca & David said land to be the property of my third son Francis Kennedy, I also give my wife Rebecca two horses her choice of my Stock &

Item I give & bequeath to my daughter Elizabett Kennedy one Negro girl named Lucy from her so long named baby, four horses & one Rock with a saddle & bridle, one bed & furniture and one cow &

Item I give & bequeath unto my son Edmund Kennedy one Negro man named Nathan, and one horse named Brandy his saddle and bridle one bed & furniture and one cow &

Item I give & bequeath unto my son Francis Kennedy one half of the plantation I now live on in Virginia pioners get their houses improvements etc etc etc by for the use of my wife Rebecca & son David & his wife Dick with one bed & furniture and one cow &

Item I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Agnes Kennedy one Negro girl named Harriet & one horse Saddle & Bridle one bed & furniture and one cow &

Item I give & bequeath unto my son Thomas Kennedy one Negro boy named Samuels & one Negro boy named Jack & three hundred dollars in money & one horse Saddle & Bridle one bed & furniture with one cow & I give & bequeath unto my wife Rebecca Kennedy the remainder of my household & kitchen furniture, farming utensils & all the remainder of my Stock of cattle Hogs & Sheep to be hers forever And I do my spouse present & future disannue to make void all former wills or testaments by me made & void I do now appoint my wife Rebecca Kennedy & my son Edmund Kennedy my legal & lawfully executors in my said will & Testement, In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal the day before above written & sealed in presence of John McInerney & James Dunn & John

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In the Name of God Amen. I James W. Bright of the County of  
Mecklenburg State of North Carolina being of sound & disposing  
Mind & Memory Do make & subscribe this 1<sup>st</sup> day of January and no other  
to be my last will and Testament. My Testimony and no other  
it is my desire the full my last will be paid as soon  
as possible after my decease.

2d As to the remainder of my property after my debts are paid it  
is my will that it be disposed of as follows. To my beloved wife  
Ann W. Bright Grand & Beget all my Negroes worn out Big, one  
Negro boy Duff, my negro girl Nancy Mabille, the my boy two  
named Nancy, my riding Gig her saddle & bridle, two beds with  
suitable furniture her choices two Boxes & bedding one Bureau  
I own & its belongs to its owner, my Cherry tree corner  
cupboard, Likewise the use & privilege of my dwelling house  
and other out Buildings, with the rest of all the household  
furniture, ornaments, for herself & family so long as they remain  
in a family capacity or the remaining in the said possession.

3d To my beloved son John Bright I will bequeath together  
with the lot or parcels of Land & slaves already disposed to him  
my negro boy Sandy & Henry, also one slave called Caesar  
which he is in possession of, also ironings now in his possession  
also my single Triggered Rifle gun, together with whatsoever  
other articles I may have heretofore given him. To my  
grandson of Ann Bright and son of Daniels I give also  
one month my negro boy Abram. The above I consider  
as his just share of my estate at this time.

4. To my beloved son James Bright I give the same estate him. This  
is, one acre land lot or parcels of land lying up part of the  
plantation on his bounded as follows Big Beggar's  
on the west bank of big sugar creek at the mouth of the stream,  
between houses with said branch inlet, both opposite to the Negro  
grave yard. House with that on the side opposite to meadow houses  
in which a house or cabin on his property by Mr. H. is a 13 acre  
part near the road leading to Hight Mill, Hight Mill is a  
House to the river side, there is a stone bridge leading to  
Mr. Donald's farm on pine hill. There is a bridge leading to

is my will that it be disposed of as follows. To my beloved wife  
Anna M'Knight I bequeath my negro woman Big, my

named Fancy, my riding Gig her saddle & bridle, two beds with  
suitable furniture his choices two Pans & plates one Bureau  
lawn & stockings to it, Riding utensils, my Cherry tree com-  
bined cupboard, Likewise, the use & privilege of my dwelling house  
and other out Buildings, with the use of all the household  
furniture, necessaries for herself & family so long as they remain  
in a family capacity or the remains in her widowhood.

3<sup>a</sup> To my beloved son David M'Knight I will & bequeath together  
with the lot of land I have already deeded to him  
my negro boy Stanley & Henry, also one more called David  
which he is in possession of, also two horses now at his disposal  
also my single Fowged Rifle gun, together with whatsoever  
other articles ~~there~~ <sup>not</sup> given him. — To my  
grandson James M'Knight and son of David I give and  
bequeath my negro boy Abram — the above I consider  
as his just share of my estate at this time.

4. To my beloved Anna M'Knight I give & bequeath him this  
He is, in all that lot or part of land lying upland of the  
plantation on his bounded as follows viz Beginning  
on the west bank of big sugar creek at the mouth of the stream,  
the north corner with said branch of it, and opposite in the negro  
grave yard. Then with the stream to its junction with the  
stream in an acre or more on yesterday by Mr. Herren's a Black  
gate near the road leading to H'ville, then with the  
H'ville to H'ville line, then with the S. E. & W. lines to  
M'Dowell's line on pine hill, then with my own line to the  
beginning etc which course will more fully appear from  
a plat thereof made out by Mr. John Herren and filed in  
among my land papers, also the ground on the top of

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brook lying between my meadows and the lot I have laid off  
is my son David who bought like my negro boy Edmund Joe  
Pearson & Crispin, also one bed and suitable furniture to  
go there with whatever articles of property I may have given him heretofore  
To my beloved son William McKnight I give & bequeath to him  
Gus, his former all the remainder of my lands & having that part  
of my plantation known as the lot which my Mansion house  
stands, subject to the encumbrance of his Mother I do, but while  
they remain in a family capacity that is to say so long as his  
Mother remains a widow and his sisters unmarried also  
my negro boys Charles, Bob & Jack one horse named Romeo  
my waggon 8 years, also my plantation Waggon, my other  
one to have the use of the waggons when needed until they  
become supplied with waggons of their own, and my double  
Saddled Sleigh given, less my farm my slaves my Dutchman  
my other sons to have the use of them needed my Grandson

my negro girl Rachel — To my said Son-in-law Peter Price three  
named pieces which he has possession of and all other articles of  
property I have given them & part in their possession heretofore —  
7. To my beloved Daughter Catharine L. McKnight I give & bequeath  
my negro girls Sylvia, boy Alfred, girl Cynthia and boy Andy  
one horse Saddle & Bridle worth eighty dollars, one cow & calf  
one spinning wheel & Cards in bidding and other household and  
Kitchen, minister I give also to her daughter Nancy Price —  
8. To my beloved Daughter Mary A. McKnight I will & bequeath  
my negro girl named Hannah boy Tom & girl Grace & Martha  
one horse Saddle & Bridle worth eighty dollars, one cow & calf  
Bidding & other furniture to make her in these respects to be  
equal with my sister —

9. I will and desire that my negro woman Latty be remain-

go together with whatever articles of property I may have given him heretofore  
To my beloved son William McKnight I give & bequeath the sum of  
fifty dollars for me to sell the remainder of my lands & having that part  
of my plantations in the line on the river which my mansion house  
stands, subject to the encumbrance of his mother I do, but while  
they remain in a family capacity that is to say so long as his  
mother remains a widow and his sister unmarried also  
my negro boy Charles, Bob & Jack one horse named Horse  
my waggon 8 years, also my plantation Waggon, my other  
one to have the use of the waggon when needed until they  
become supplied with waggons of their own, and my double  
boggeded Horses Green, like my farm, to himself my Friends have  
my other sons to have the use of what he needs, my grandsons  
my beloved nephews and one bed & bedstead, furniture  
together with his saddle and bridle.

5. To my beloved son in law Peter Price & his wife my negro Boy  
named Sam. To my beloved Daughters Mary P. Price my negro woman  
Sister and boy Eli Thompson. To my Grand Daughter Mary Price  
my negro girl Martha. Mecklenburg Co. NC Wills 1783-1844  
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named Peter to which he has possession of and all other articles of  
possession I have given them & part in their portion heretofore.

7. To my beloved Daughter Catharine L. McKnight I give & bequeath  
my negro girls Sylvia, Boy Alfred, Girl Cynthia and boy Andy  
one horse saddle & bridle worth eighty dollars, one iron & calpe  
one of ironing wheel & carder for bedding and other house hold and  
Kitchen utensils equal to her sister Mary Price.

8. To my beloved Daughter Mary A. McKnight I will & bequeath  
my negro girl named Hannah Boy Joe and Girls Grace & Martha  
one horse Saddle & bridle worth eight dollars, one iron & calpe  
bedding & other furniture to make her in these respects to an  
even division.

9. I will and desire that my negro woman Abby be & remain  
with my wife & family on the plantation to the date now and  
hereafter of my wife & family that remain in a family capacity  
and at the death of my said wife (or in case she should marry)  
and cease in my life, I will & direct that the said negro
