 my maker - As for my buriall I desire it may be without pomp or state
 but decent at the discretion of my Executors & children, And as to
 my Worldey estate after just debts & general expences paid -
 I give it may be divided as follows Viz. Item. I give & bequeath
 to my beloved children Zephanius John, Benjamin John, Daniel
 John & Roger John my tract of Land I now live on to be equally
 divided as follows Zephanius John to have his estate -
 number of Cows including his plantation where he now lives
 & Benjamin John his number of Cows including his clear fields
 & Daniel & Roger John have their number of Cows including
 the plantation where I now live to be divided as they agree
 between them two selves. Item. I give unto my son Daniel
 John one Cow his choice of my Stock of cattle about this
 plantation & the remainder of the cattle to be equally
 divided as they can agree to Zephanius John, Daniel John
 & Roger John, I likewise give to my son Daniel John a large
 brown horse three years old which was raised in Georgia
 & the remainder of my Stock of horses that is about in this
 Neigbor I give to be equally divided between my sons Daniel
 John, & Roger John as they can agree. Item. I give to my beloved
 son Benjamin John all my cattle & horses in the province of
 Georgia that was left there last Spring when the others were
 brought away, Item. I give to my son Zephanius John one
 weather & cow; and the rest of the sheep to be divided between
 my sons Daniel & Roger John, Item. I give & bequeath to my
 son Zephanius John one bed quilt & one big pot. Item. I give
 to my sons Daniel & Roger John all my money which is due
 to me by note. Item. I give to my beloved Daughter-in-law Eliza

give, choose & chuse you of the sum in the following manner & form
first of all, I will all my lands, real & personal to my wife
Elizabeth Fawcett, & her heirs & assigns & all my dwelling
houses in which I now live with my trust of lands which I now
live on to my loving wife which during her life intend to keep open
as without let or hindrance, wasteage & expense. Let the separation
of the aforesaid sum by will & pleasure be that the above mentioned
trust of land or estate, & I do hereby appoint & ordain my executors
herein after named to sell & dispose said lands to all who will & bear
thereon as I in person could have done. — Also I will to my
wife, being her choice of the Horse bucklers with two bows, with all
my household furniture except my bed & other furniture worth
a small money & will further her a saddle out of my estate
I do leave to my son Edmund Fawcett my hunting gun in trust
to my brother Robert until he come to the age of eighteen to
be delivered to him, otherwise leave to my daughter Elizabeth
