

In the name of God Amen. I, Henry Price of the State of North Carolina & County of Mecklenburg, being of sound mind & memory & in perfect health (as only excepted) do on this 11th of September 1804 make & constitute & appoint this instrument operating to be my last will & testament; and first I give my soul to God who gave it & my body to be buried in a decent Christian manner and as to the worldly estate which God in his providence has blessed me with, I give & bequeath, I give & bequeath to my children & grandchildren in the following manner etc. I give & bequeath to my son Isaac Price one dollar. 2nd I give & bequeath to my son Reese Price his fathers clothes & Twenty five dollars. 3rd I give & bequeath to my son William Price my Marthy or third part of the land left me by my husband exclusive of my house to be laid off next to Major David Harts also my large Bible & Heralds Works — 4th I give & bequeath to my son Southern Price my dwelling house & his fathers riding horse; — 5th I give & bequeath to my daughter Mitchell ^{etc} Twenty five dollars; 6th I give & bequeath to my daughter Cherry Brown one negro girl named Phoebe upon condition she pays to my grand daughter Dorcas Reed Twenty five dollars & twenty five to Mary Brown said. Also I bequeath to my daughter Mary Brown my body cloths & Wallett & Gold; 7th I give & bequeath to my grand daughter Cynthia Brown one bed & furniture 8th I give & bequeath to my grand daughter Mary Price (Southern) ^{etc} on bed & furniture & one Chest dresses; 9th I give & bequeath to my Grandson Thomas Price (son of John Price) Twenty five dollars — 10th I give & bequeath to my grand daughter Mary Carr & Harry Know Twenty five dollars each; 11th I give & bequeath to my grand son Tho's Price Twenty five dollars; I allow my negro boy to be sold at whatever credit my executors may think proper to discharge the above legacies & the remainder of the money after all debts and demands are discharged I allow for the maintenance of the two old negroes Simpson & Rhodes, I allow them to be taken care of by William Price or Benjamin Brown the negro to choose their place of abode, & the remainder of my property not disposed of in this my last testament I allow to be equally divided between my sons, William, Jonathan & Benjamin Price. And I do appoint my son William Price my executor by william brown.

do make this <sup>7th day of February in the year of our Lord 1809 make
this my last Will & Testament in manner and
form, following. 1st It is my will & desire that the plantation
which I now live in equally divided between my two sons
Peter & John Peele by a straight line running from meadow
gate to Harper Branch leaving the lower part to my son James
& the upper part to my son John to them & their heirs forever —
such. It is my desire that the said land be left of & divided by
my executors which shall be named hereafter, but it is further my
will that my slaves be equally divided between my said two sons
I give & bequeath to my son James my large house Bible
2d I give & bequeath to my son John my book intitled Lamb's
Praying to Jesus. 4th I give & bequeath to my beloved daughter
Catherine Black one negro girl named Penelope. 5th I give &
bequeath to my beloved daughter Elizabeth Duckworth one negro
girl named Dicy. 6th I give & bequeath to my beloved daughter
Sarah Peck one negro woman named Rhode Island, my bed & bedding
with all the furniture belonging to said bed, also one chest of
drawers & all the furniture were that is in the house belonging to
me, also one young boy more than years old but not twenty four
pounds in money to be at her choice which she will take
and it is further my will that the remainder of my negro slaves
& other property be sold, my funeral expences to just debts paid &
if any remainder should be it is my will & desire that it be
equally divided between my two children Peter, John, Peck</sup>
