this my last & Testament I allow to be equally divided between
my sons, William, Jonathan & Benjamin Brumond. And I do
appoint my son William Price John in law Benjamin Brumond

4th witnesses of this my last Will & Testament, and I do hereby revoke
disannul all, former Wills & Testaments and declare this & this
