

I now that in my will that my two sons James & John Robison
for the use of the widow & my sons James & John Robison
I also bequeath the same plantation again & the tools to the above
named James & John Robison & they may again between
themselves I do hereby bequeath to my son Isaac Hamilton
Robison one hundred acres of Land on Twelve mile creek
& at my death in the said Hamilton Robison I shall left
but not have on him of eighty or ninety dollars it is
my will that son Daniels have & the two other Nurses
Dennis & Kate to teach this plantation — Now even I order
& constitute my two sons James & John Robison to be the
Executors of this my will & to take care for the same
whereof I have here set my hand & affixed my seal this
11th day of August 1811

In the name of God Amen, I Mary C Reed of the County of
Washington, District of Columbia, being weak in body but of
a sound & disposing mind then coming to it is appointed, for
all to see; have thought proper to make this my last will
& Testament as follows. In the first place I bequeath my
soul unto God who gave it & my body to the earth to be
in a Christian manner. Item I leave it to my beloved
brother William Reed all my claim to lands in the
western country left me by my father will which lands
were not yet divided nor settled in any way among
the 3 of us & also one half of the price of my negro boy
George whom I allow to be sold & moreover bequeath to my
brother William a note of one hundred dollars due
to me from my brother Jonathan Reed. Item I leave
to my brother Jonathan the other half of the price of

George provided he lets the unsold property of my father's estate
remain as always independent of he makes any change in
the division, as it was made by my father in that the whole
price of George go to my brother William except one fourth
part which I give to my sister Louisa. Item 4th I will to my
brother a note of \$1000 which my father gave me from
Elizabeth Dobbin. Item 5th I will to my sister
Louisa my father's gold watch & chain also my bed and
bedding except one quilt. Item 6th I leave my various articles I have begun with her I desire to remain
in the hands of my brother William until she comes
to her. Item 7th I will to my sister Anne Martha Read
my half round table & single chair table & also
my wheel. Item 8th I will to my brother Stephen Taylor
read my claim to the land which my father left
in his will to my brother Elizabeth Dobbin during his
life time. Item 9th I will to my brother James Dixon forty
dollars. Item 10th I will to my brother Warren Thompson
forty dollars out of the residue of my property
not mentioned in the preceding. Item 11th I leave what remains in debt
I began with to my brother William Read, & it is my will
that my brother William pay all my just debts out of
that part of my father's estate given to him & that
the other legates be answerable to pay no part thereof.
Finally it is my will that my brother William and
I am attorney for my executor to execute effect this my
last will & testament in the business which I have written
at my house & office my brother is the 1st day of July 1825
