 Robison one hundred acres of Land on Twelve mile creek
 & at my death in the said Hamilton Robison shall left
 to & he to have on him of eighty or ninety dollars it is
 my will that son Dennis have & the two other Nephews
 Deane & hale to hold this plantation - I have seen & used in
 & constitute my two sons James & John Robison to be the
 Executors of this my last will & testament. In witness
 whereof I have here set my hand & signed my seal this
 11th day of August 1784

 in a Christian manner. Item I bequeath to my beloved
 brother William Reed all my claim to Land in the
 Western Country left me by my Fathers will, which Land
 was not yet divided nor settled in any way among
 the Sogals & also one half of the price of my negro boy
 George whom I allow to be sold & more one half to my
 brother William in a note of one hundred dollars due
 to me from my brother Jonathan Reed. Item I bequeath
 to my brother Jonathan the other half of the price of
