 sold and divided amongst my children as the law directs, viz.
 one cotton wheel Patent right, one Reel, one Table, two pewter
 plates, six pewter plates, one brass, one old hat and anything
 else belonging to me not comprehended in the above will to be
 sold & the sum in which my hand I seal the 28th day of Dec. 1842

33 In the name of God Amen. It be it remembered that I, William
 Williams of & being weak in body but of sound & perfect mind & memory
 or may see fit, considering the uncertainty of this mortal life, I being
 of sound & perfect mind & memory blessed be Almighty God, do make
 & publish this my last will & testament in manner & form
 following that is to say first, I allow all my just debts to be paid
 this, I do give & bequeath unto my
 beloved wife Fannie Williams the use of my plantation on which
 I now live during her life time or so long as she may live
 & household furniture such as may be judged necessary, one bay mare
 & three cows, two plows & the pair of axes & two hoes & an old
 & fine shawl & one year's provision laid out of all of these things that
 at her death or marriage to be set apart the best & better to be
 her share for provision, I give & bequeath a piece to my two daughters
 Sarah Kelly & Elizabeth Cannon at the time limited given in the
 distribution, then at the death or marriage of my wife or death of
 either of us I do equally divide between my two daughters Sarah Kelly
 & Elizabeth, one half of my present land & I do give & bequeath to
 my daughter Sarah Kelly & Elizabeth, the sum of \$1000 my present
 & future earnings, hereby making all former wills by me made, in witness
 hereof I set my hand & seal the 28th day of Dec. 1842, Wm. Williams.
