My Will as by declaration on oath before me declare
Impious I will give & bequeath to my son Robert Wilson my negro
Girl provided he pays Charity Conner, William Wilson & Lilly
Conner each of them one fourth of the value of said negro
which said valuation is to be appraised by Jos^{ph} McNeill, George
& Hugh Torrance or James Conner. Them I also will be
bequeath to my son Robert my best bed & furniture viz
one pair of blankets, one covered, & two cupboards &
sheets to be picked by my daughter Lilly Conner, also
all the household table & kitchen furniture except
as here after mentioned, also one half of what is in his
& my son son Williams hands, also half of the value
of my mare which is to be sold also all the cloth &
yarn now in the house or making. Them I will be
bequeath to my daughter Lilly my saddle, 7 or 8 dog
plates to be her choice & one fourth of the value of my
negro Girl; Them I will bequeath to my son William
Wilson one fourth of the price of my negro Girl, one half
of what is in his & Roberts hands, one pound pair one
little blanket one & one half of the pair of men to be
sold as aforesaid; Them I will bequeath to my grand
Daughters Charity McConnell & Peggy Conner one bed &
furniture to each the best bed & worst furniture to go
together to be picked & regulated by my daughter Lilly
& to be kept by her for them until they need them
Them I will bequeath to my grand daughter

Charity M Council one fourth of the value of the above
said negro girl declared his will before

horse named Dick Item I to Elijah Baker one negro

woman named Letitia & one Negro boy named Tom

Item 3^d to Elijah Baker second daughter named

Eliza Baker one hundred pounds in money.

We the above named legates being present & agreeing to

the above dispositions of property do bind ourselves to

stand to the same firm, as witness our hands here

unto 1st our hands & seal this day & year above written
