In the House of Fed. Conv. April 27th 1815 I being
 in the County of Cheshire County & State of N. H. being
 of sound mind & memory I do hereby make this my last will & Testament, under seal &
 in presence of my friends to wit that I give to my body to be

 worldly estate leave it on the following manner viz
James & Elizabeth 1st my transferable stock to be paid -
 I give & bequeath to my grand daughter Elizabeth Perkins &
 living with my wife & children with all its furniture my Gray
 mare & my bridle my bed that I lay on with all its furniture
 a cow & calf, her choice of my flock, & a piece of horse shoe
 also a black cloth now in the house - and the remainder of
 my property to be divided as the law directs to be divided -
 I do hereby certify that I am of sound mind & memory
 & I have signed this my last will & Testament of the
 above I have signed to be my hand & affixed my seal
 to be in witness whereof
