

Will of Nathaniel Morrison

In the name of God Amen  
 of Westmorland County I Nathaniel Morrison of the County aforesaid  
 Being in good health & sound in memory for which I desire to  
 thank Almighty God the grace & protection of all my Masters, you  
 at the same time when I consider the certainty of life and the  
 certainty of death I think it my indispensable duty to order my  
 family affairs in such a manner whilst I am capable as that I may  
 most justly settling them; and prayed I humbly hope under the  
 direction of Providence following my death it shall please  
 Almighty God who I commend this body & implore his grace to  
 break up that Union in a while by death I desire to leave  
 myself resigned to his Sovereign will both here & home as a broad  
 way his grace prepared me for the important trial herein.

After my Soul having come my body I commit to the dust  
 in hope of a joyful resurrection, had my soul into my heavenly  
 fathers hand there the merits of my sweet Lord Jesus whom  
 it is by a dear bought purchase my body to be decently  
 buried if at home & in a Christian like manner at the dis-  
 cretion of my Executors out of my undivided estate. But if  
 abroad the God in whose trust will superintend the solemnity  
 in his gracious providence to whom I am not to prescribe -  
 After I do hereby declare that my just & lawful debts before paid out  
 of my estate Debt & personal; after which I bequeath unto my  
 dear & loving wife Annabelle Morrison the Negro slave called  
 Rose during her widowhood or natural life to be & her own  
 disposal at her death as a Dower exclusive of other proper things  
 After I bequeath unto my Eldest daughter Hannah these one thousand  
 dollars of three pounds ten shillings in the year 1772 -

After the remainder of my Estate &c & personal after the above named  
 distribution, I do hereby order & request to be equally divided between  
 my seven remaining children viz Elizabeth, Anna & Jane, William  
 John, Alexander & Charles & Jane each to receive an equal part  
 except Alexander & Charles who hath received a great part already  
 but much little for which she hath given as so much of her part  
 After I do hereby constitute & ordain my dearest beloved wife & second person  
 of my wife does meet at her own pleasure to be my sole & entire Executrix

at the same time when I consider the certainty of death and the  
certainty of death I think it my indispenable duty to order my  
family affairs in such a manner whiloe I am capable as that I can  
most justly settling them; and pround I humbly hope under the  
direction of mannae following being to whom it shall please  
Almighty God who command this body & impud his soul to  
break up that Union in a while by death I desire to leave  
my resignt to his Sovereign will both there at home or abroad

of my Estate Real & personal; after which I bequeath unto my  
dear & loving wife Annabella Morrison the Negro slave called  
Doe during her lordships natural life to be at her own  
disposal at her death as a Dowry exclusive of the proper third  
MUR. I bequeath unto my Eldest daughter Hannah there am locust the  
sum of Three hundred ten shillings in the year 1772 -

MUR. The remainder of my Estate Real & personal after the above named  
Distribution I do hereby order & request to be equally divided betwix  
my seven remaining children viz Margaret, Anna, Willm  
John, Elizabeth & Amelia & they cannot receive an equal part  
except Margaret who who hath received a great part already  
but must take for which she hath given as so much of her part  
I do hereby constribute & ordain my deare beloved wife & second person  
of my wife does meet at her own chace to be my sole & entire Executrix  
to all & every part thereof as the will and my last dying before the  
Judge of all them there by to be aside all other bodily heretofore in me de  
not having this my last will & Testament delivered to witness of these oaths  
the 1<sup>st</sup> day of June 1781 -
