 discretion of my Executors hereafter appointed, And concerning
 my worldly property I declare as in the following mannerly

Item I give & bequeath unto my loving wife Ann Christenberry
 all the real & personal property that I am now possessed of
 Every part & parcel thereof during her natural life; Then
 to be Equally divided between my son Joseph & my Daughter
 Sally Except this land I now live on, I do allow & do my
 will that the said Land shall be by my son Joseph to him
 and his heirs, even after the decease of my loving wife Ann
 And Lastly I do constitute & appoint my true & trusty
 son Joseph my Executor to execute this my last will and
 Testament hereby revoking all former wills Testaments by
 me made, & saying that I have none other to be my last will and
 Testament; In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
 & seal the day & year above written.
