In the name of GOD amen. I Nicholas Peckwick of the County of Rock
dwelling in the free & independent state of Carolina, &c., being
very sick & weak in body but of perfect mind & memory, thanksgiving
unto God, calling unto mind the Mortality of my body & knowing
that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make & publish in this
my last will & Testament, that is to say principally by hand of O.H. I
give & bequeath my soul into the hand of Almighty God that grants
my body I command to the Earth to be buried in a decent Christian
burial at the discretion of my executors, nothing doubting
but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again
by the mighty power of God, touch as concerning such worldly estate
wherewith it has pleased God to bless me in this life I give devise
& dispose of the same in the following manner & form -

First. I give & bequeath to Elizabeth Chapman my dearly beloved wife
my Great Mass together with a Side saddle & Bridle, likewise a Cow with
a half feather in her head & loaded with two fine thick white blanket
further my Chariot of a white colour further her spinning wheel &
also another spinning wheel that is to say a great wheel for the
spinning of woolkin & one piece of cotton card, further my
metal basket & a ditto pot, that is to be understood the second of
my metal p. to likewise a powder dish & a great abroad h. t. of
ditto, likewise four small plates of ditto & some poyson, further a
great brass spoon, further a pack bound with iron hoops, further
all my flax as well as all yarn or twist both of linen & also
cotton - Secondly, I give by these presents to the above named Elizabeth
Chapman, I, and wife the full power & and unity over my plantation
to crop on it according to her complete will & pleasure, also
and I will be liable to maintain my wife during the same
she is liable to keep the said plantation in the same condition as
I leave it, which grant is to continue as long as she remains a
widow wherein she get married she is to leave the place & then
to have no more to it, and in this case O.C. her heirs may & will

mentioned hereafter for the Care & Maintenance of the same & further
 if she remains a widow she is intitled to one of either benefit more
 than herself in a Settlement concerning the Estates of the Heirs of my
 plantation, but on the contrary she is not intitled to the least of
 such benefits, whenever she gets married, besides this my son Henry
 shall suffer my wife to live in his dwelling House soe that he
 may let her & suffer her the necessaries of her life to procure me
 the said plantation - Secondly, I give & bequeath to my son Henry &
 & singularly my Land, messenger, & Instruments by him to be possessed & enjoyed for
 him & his Heirs & Assigns for ever, but he shall be liable to the following
 article, viz he shall pay the sum of one hundred & fifty pounds to his
 two brothers, and sister fifty pounds Gold or Silver Coin to each of
 them & fifty pounds to his brother Edm, fifty pounds to his
 brother Rich & fifty pounds to his sister Char - he is to pay
 up to the bequest of my plantation when he is arrived to the
 age of twenty one years, but liable to the Maintenance of the
 younger brother & sister until the youngest is arrived to the
 eleventh time of age, Provided they all are liable to work
 for him as hired Workmen, without any other wages during
 the said time, but to represent the bequest of all my Lands
 messenger & Instruments as likewise the care & Education & man-
 taining is as aforesaid granted to my wife to the full end & term of
 the Minority of my son Henry, except in case of Matrimony con-
 cuted by her - Further my son Henry is to give to my wife from the
 time of his age of twenty one years even to the end of the life of my
 wife if she remains a widow, for her maintenance per annum
 at least twelve bushels of wheat well cleaned, & fifteen bush-
 els of corn, two gallons of Brandy or Rum or Rishay, eight pounds
 of sugar, four pounds of flour, likewise a garden & a small vine
 as is sufficient to furnish the wants of her Kitchen, she is
 intitled to choose the place for the same where she pleases, so far as
 for her which has a right to whatever his Master will give him
 likewise to be lawful for her to raise some hogs intitled to same
 privilege of his bacon, after then he shall no longer to furnish & keep
 and continue to work all which he is liable to furnish for my

such benefit, whensoever she gets married, & resides in my service,
shall suffer my wife to live in his dwelling House without cost to
me last her, I to suffer no the miseries of his life to procure me
the said plantation - Secondly, I give & bequeath to my son Henry &
& singularly my Land, messenger, & servants by him to be possessed & enjoyed for
him & his Heirs Designes for ever, but he shall be liable to the following
articles, viz he shall pay the sum of one hundred & fifty pounds to his
two brothers, and sister fifty pounds Gold or Silver Loin to each of
them as fifty pounds to his brother John, fifty pounds to his
brother Edmund & fifty pounds to his sister Mary - he is to possess
4 to the proportion of my plantations when he is arrived to the
age of twenty one years, but liable to the Maintenance of the
younger Brothers & Sister until the youngest is arrived to the
eldest time of age, Provided they all are liable to work
for him as hired workmen, without any further charge than
the said time, but to represent the proportion of all my Lands
Message & Servants as likewise the case of Education & Main-
taining is as aforesaid granted to my wife to the full and & firm
the Minority of my son Henry, except in case of Matrimony con-
tracted by him - Further my son Henry is to give to my wife from the
time of his age of twenty one years even to the end of the life of my
wife if she remains a widow, for her maintenance & pension
a yearly twelve bushels of wheat well cleaned, & fifteen bushels
of corn, two gallons of Brandy or Rum or Whiskey, eight pounds
of fat & four pounds of lard, likewise a garden & orchard land
as is sufficient to furnish the wants of her Kitchen, she is
intended to choose the place for the same, when she pleases, & to allow
for her which has a right to where ever his cattle will go to pasture
likewise to be lawful for her to raise some hogs intitled to same
priviledges of his Oxen, After that he shall be liable to furnish & keep
a good boar to work all which he is liable to furnish for my
wife upon his own proper cost & charges either as long as she
lives a widow or on the contrary even to the end of her natural life
Finally I give & bequeath to my wife above intitled Dr. Henry
& William Gottliebe Lieber Plasmane, likewise a prayer book intitled
Friedrich & Esther Hand Books -

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To my son Henry I bequeath a Harpunger Lutherian Song Book likewise
A Hulberg Song book. To my son Christopher I bequeath a Hulberg
Song Book with a New Testament, likewise a book called City Schools
in my Son Adam I bequeath the Holy Bible with a New Testament.
To my Daughter Anna Maria I bequeath a quantity of Good Books
several copies of Poetry likewise a Book intitled Bygodesm of
Likewise the Thirteenth Psalm Psalms — True Stories as there is
described by what was my children are to be educated & Maintained
I therefore forbid the bond or obligation of them except when my sons
come to the age of fifteen years, this case is to be taken that they might be
employed to the apprenticeship of any honest trade they may choose
according to their abilities in such case my executors may bind them
if they so choose, and I hereby charge my executors to see
that under no consideration will my children be sent to any Religious
order to instruct them in the principles of Christianity & poetry
not suffering them to receive their liberty to live, bedrest, rives or
entertainment but to keep them back from all manner of the above
and other evil society.

Lastly, I do hereby constitute make & ordain Mr Henry
Soperen & Mr Castle House Executors of this my last will &
Testament, and I do hereby utterly disallow & make
disannul ~~all~~ every other former testament, will, Legacy
Bequests & Executors by me in any kind before named, killed,
& bequeathed, Ratifying & confirming this I now leave to be my
last will & testament the witness whereof I have hereunto set
my hand & seal this 25th day of July in the year of our Lord
1781 — signed, sealed, published, pronounced & declared
by the said Christopher Frederick as his last will &
Testament in the presence of us, who in his presence do
in the presence of each other have hereunto subscribed
our names,
