 make this my last will & Testament in manner & form following —
 1^o I will that all my just debts be honestly paid by my last known friends
 2^o To my beloved wife Mary I bequeath her leave over book furniture
 & cloths and our child however by the name of her known & the clothing
 in said chest & all the household, kitchen & chamber furniture
 except what I particularly hereafter name & my large Bible
 and all my other books and my house with her wife & Rock
 and to have free possession of my mansion house & to have again
 full use of this my farm during her life and to be at her own
 disposal at her death — .

3^o To my Daughter Margaret I bequeath one Dollar &
 4^o To my son Robert I bequeath one Dollar ...
 5^o To my Daughter Eleanor I bequeath one Dollar ...
 6^o To my daughter Mary I bequeath one dollar ...
 7^o To my son James I bequeath a piece of land to begin on his property
 near the road leading from my house to Seawright Borghfield & to run
 N.W. & S.E. & opposite the upper corner of my old field now said
 road from Thomas a straight corner left it striking the south corner of
 his house also said also my compound &

8^o To my Daughter Agnes I bequeath one Dollar ...
 9^o To my son William I bequeath the remainder of the place to live
 in hereon I now leave to him, following conditions to be observed in this
 before he has any title to his present wife. These may lawfully be sold
 by my executors & the proceeds equally divided between myself, my son
 Robert, James, Eleanor, Mary & Agnes, and between
 to my two physicians at my funeral expenses.
 And I do hereby nominate & appoint my son James Brown and
 James Vagont executors of this my last will & Testament hereby
 I nominate all others will & witness, & agents & testaments

2^d To my beloved wife Mary I bequeath two cows, one black, one white
& a black & one chestnut horse by the name of her mare & the clothes
in which I wear. I call the household, kitchen & chamber furniture
except what I particularly hereafter name & my large Bible
and all my other books and my horse with her wheel & Rock
and to have full disposition of my mansion house & to have again
full blessing of this my fair in choosing her life and to be at her own
disposal at her death.

3^d To my Daughter Margaret I bequeath one dollar +

4^d To my son Robert I bequeath one dollar +

5^d To my daughter Eleanor I bequeath one dollar +

6^d To my daughter Mary I bequeath one dollar +

7^d To my son James I bequeath a piece of land to begin on his home
near the road leading from my house to Town Borrough & to run
across said road opposite the upper corner of my old field now said
road from Thomas a straight course till it strikes the south corner of
his barn old field also my cupboard +

8^d To my Daughter Elizabeth I bequeath one dollar +

9^d To my son William I bequeath the remainder of the place to him
to have an inheritance in the following conditions to have the same
in full he has any heirs by his present wife. Then my land to be sold
by my executors & the proceeds equally divided between myself, James
Robert, Christopher, Robert, James, Eleanor, Mary & George. And then
to my wife Elizabeth a sum of money sufficient to her use

And I do hereby nominate & appoint my son James Brown and
James Vayant executors of this my last will & testament hereby

Witnessed this 1st day of April 1783. Signed & executed by the said

Patrick Brown the testator as his last will & testament.
