 in Candlish of Johnson County, pro habundantia very sick & weak in body
 but of perfect mind & memory, thank be given unto God; therefore
 calling unto mind the mortality of my body & knowing that it is
 appointed for all men once to die; Do make & ordain this my last will
 & Testament, that is to say Principally & first of all, I give & recommend
 my soul into the hand of Almighty God that gave it, and my body I recom-
 mend to the earth to be buried in decent Christian burial at the discre-
 tion of my Executors nothing doubting but at the general resurrection
 I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God; and as
 I have being sick heretofore & know with it had pleased God to bless
 in this life I give & bequeath to the same in the following manner
 & form first I give & bequeath to my dear & loved wife the
 half of this plantation from the line on as long as she lives, & also to my little
 beloved daughter Lettice M Candlish the other half of the said plantation
 and at her decease she is to leave it to the said Lettice M Candlish & if the
 execution sees cause to sell & dispose of the said land the money to be
 divided equally between the two, and the said Lettice to retain the half
 at her decease to her daughter also all the houses & goods I own
 also all the growing in the ground that she loves some & others

also have horses & pones & all belonging to said pones one Gray mare, also
 all the Cose kind to be divided Equally between the said two except
 one Steer & some cows that I have further use of the horse, also have
 Eight pounds of Scotch Whittings & the pones also one pound more
 all present to me from Mary widow my beloved wife, also have
 six hundred of horses here to my daughter Lettice also one pound
 five Shillings more also to Lettice Elizabeth I have my saddle
 Also I give to my well beloved wife & William my son whom
 I likewise constitute my sole executor of this
 my last will & Testament, and do hereby utterly disallow
 revoke & disannul all & every other former Testament wills
 Legacies Bequests & executors by me in any wise before now
 written & by you or their Ratifying & confirming this & no other to be
 my last will & Testament. The witnesses I have hereunto set my hand
 & seal the day & year above written
