hereby constittute & appoint my Son Hugh Morgan & Samuel
Blacks to be my sole Executrix to this my last Will and Testam-
ent disannulling all & every other former Wills & Testaments &
I giveth be me named willd & signeath before Certifying
& confirming this & no other to be my last Will & Testament

sound mind & memory, calling to remembrance the uncertainty of
life & that it is appointed unto all men once to die, Do hereby
constitute & appoint this to be my last Will & Testament in man-
ner & form following, that is to say first I recommend my soul
into the hands of Almighty God who gave it me, and my body
to the earth from whence it came In hopes of a joyful

Resurrection tho' my Mediator Jesus Christ; And as to what
worldly goods it has pleased God to bless me with, I dispose
of as follows etc. that is to say -

I bind to my beloved wife Mary Fisher all the whole estate
that I am possessed with at this time both real & personal during
her widowhood in order to provide & support my children, her in
case she marry or wax wanton & behave herself unseemly my
desire is that she should be disposed of the whole of my chist
and my estate equally divided among my children, Christian
William, Sylvanus, Rachel, Mary, Anna & the like to my wife
is now pregnant with if it please God the child may
live; and my desire is & I do hereby appoint my two other
William Fisher & Frederick Stans my true & lawful executors
to this my last will & Testament, declaring & revoking any
will or wills heretofore to be null & invalid, and that this my
last will & Testament be complied with, the witness whereof
the said Paul Fisher have this 6th day of February 1804 do
declare this to be his last will & Testament on the person of
me, witness present

In the name of God amen. I John Finney of the State of Connecticut
humbley & humblye, being in a sick & weak condition, yet in
my just mind & memory calling to mind the mortality of my body
knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make
this my last will & Testament, that is to say principally & first I
do give & command my soul to god that gave it, and my body
I command to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian
manner at the discretion of my executors, and as touching
such worldly estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with, I do
dispose of in the following manner; and in the first place I
do leave all my lawful debts well & truly to be paid. In the next
place I do bequeath to my beloved & lawful married wife Ruth
