 wheel & Reel - Item, I give & bequeath unto my daughter Eliza-
 -beth all my Hags & I desire her to pay all my debts, and I do
 hereby constitute & appoint my son Hugh & Mary Ann & Samuel
 Black to be my sole Executors to this my last Will and Test. must
 disannulling all & every other former Wills & Testaments &
 Legacies be me named Willed & bequeathed before; certifying
 & confirming this & no other to be my last Will & Testament

 Mecklenburg & State of N. Carolina, being sick & weak of body, but
 sound mind & memory, calling to remembrance the uncertainty of
 life & that it is appointed unto all men once to die; Do hereby
 constitute & appoint this to be my last Will & Testament in man-
 ner & form following, that is to say first I Recommend my soul
 into the hands of Almighty God who gave it me, and my body
 to the earth from whence it came in hopes of a joyful

Resurrection thro' my mediator Jesus Christ; And as to what worldly goods it has pleased God to bless me with, I dispose of as follows &c. that is to say -

11 I leave to my beloved wife Mary Fisher all the whole estate that I am possessed with at this time both real & personal during her widowhood in order to receive & school my children, & to see that she marry or was wanton & behave herself sensibly my desire is that she should be disposed of the whole of my estate and my estate equally divided among my children, Charles William, Sylvanus, Nehemiah, Mary, Ann & the like my wife is now pregnant with if it should please God the child may live; but my desire is & I do hereby appoint my brother William Fisher & Frederic Harris my true & lawful Executors to this my last will & Testament, declaring & revoking any will or wills heretofore to be null & invalid, and that this my last will & Testament be complied with; In witness whereof the said Paul Fisher here this 6th day of February 1806 do declare this to be his last will & Testament in the presence of us, Witnesses present

In the next place I do bequeath to my beloved & lawful married wife Sarah
