In the name of God Amen. I Peter Hynans of Washington
 County in the province of N^o Carolina being weak of body
 but of perfect mind & memory, calling to my mind the mor-
 tality of my body, as it is appointed for all men once to die
 I do therefore make this my last will & Testament. In witness
 I do give my body to be decently buried & all funeral expen-
 ses to be paid & all my just debts to be paid. I do bequeath
 & give unto my beloved wife Elizabeth Hynans one
 black mare about four years old & her riding saddle
 & one bed & furniture ^{as in bill of the above mentioned} & I bequeath to her during her
 natural life my negro woman named Ann I will
 & bequeath to my little children John Springs Hynans
 & Peggy Allen Hynans & Polly Springs Hynans & Allen
Hynans & William Hynans all the share that he owes
 from the above named negro woman & which she
 holds she remains in the possession of Elizabeth my
 wife to be equally divided among my above named
 little children John, I will & bequeath to Elizabeth
 my beloved wife the plantation & improvements there-
 on now heretofore. I will & desire that
 my three sons John Sp Hynans & Allen Hynans & William
Hynans when they arrive to a sufficient age to be put
 to some good trade — Lastly I will & do consti-
 tute, appoint & declare Nathaniel Alexander &

George Allen send to be my Executors of this my last
Will & Testament, and I do revoke, Disannul & make void
all former Wills or Testaments, now or hereafter made done or
executed by me In Witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand & seal this 9th day of March 1800

In the name of God Amen. I Philip Wolf of the County of
Muhlenberg & State of N^o Carolina being weak of body but
of sound & perfect sense & memory blessed be God for it, & calling
to mind the uncertainty of life & that it is appointed for
man once to die, I recommend my soul into the hands of
God that gave it, & my body to be buried in a Christian
like manner at the discretion of my Executors. On this 5th
day of August in the Year of our Lord 1814 I do make
Publish this my last Will & Testament in the manner
& form following that is to say. Item I give & bequeath
to my son Peter Wolf the Manor plantation House &
all the Land belonging to thereunto to him & his Heirs
for ever only Excepting a free right & privilege in all
for myself & my wife Elizabeth during our joint lives
Item I give to my wife Elizabeth one Cow & calf also two
sheep, one bed & furniture, one mare & saddle one spin-
ning wheel & card, one Crock, one pot, one kettle one
table & the clothing & as much that she stands in it as
she wants during her life also three pounds of flax 3rd
pounds of picked cotton, one Chest, Item I give & bequeath
to my Eldest son Phillip Wolf His one dollar to each
child, Item I give to my son Johas Wolf His one Dollar
Item I give & bequeath to my children as follows viz -
