In the name of God Amen. I Peter Hymons of Rockbridge County in the province of N<sup>o</sup> Carolina being weak of body but of perfect mind & memory, setting to my mind the mortality of my body, as it is appointed for all men once to die I do therefore make this my last will & Testament. Inasmuch as I desire my body to be decently buried & funeral expenses to be paid & all my just debt to be paid & discharged I bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth Hymons one black mare about five years old & her riding saddle & harness <sup>as in fact of the above plantation</sup> I bequeath to her during her natural life my negro woman named her Item I will & bequeath to my little children John Springs Hymons & Peggy Hymons & Polly Springs Hymons & William Hymons all the slaves that now and from the above named negro woman down while she liveth she remaining in the possession of Elizabeth my wife to be equally divided among my above named little children Item I will & bequeath to Elizabeth my beloved wife the plantation & improvements during her lifetime Item This my will & desire that my three sons John P. Hymons & Allen Hymons & William Hymons when they attain to a sufficient age to be put to some good trade - Lastly I will make consti-  
-tute, appoint & certain Nathaniel Green the

George Allen son to be my Executrix of this my last  
Will & Testament, and I do revoke, Desecre and make void  
all former Wills or instruments whatsoever made done or  
executed by me in writing before this instrument  
set my hand & seal this 9<sup>th</sup> day of March 1800

In the name of God Amen. I Philip Wolf of the County of  
Muhlenberg State of NC Carolina being weak of body but  
of sound & perfect sense & memory blessed be God for it, & nothing  
to mind the uncertainty of life & that it is appointed for  
men once to die, I recommend my soul into the hands of  
God that gave it, & my body to be buried in a Christian  
like manner at the discretion of my Executor Do this 5<sup>th</sup>  
day of August in the Year of our Lord 1814 Do make  
Publish this my last Will & Testament in the manner  
& form following that is to say— Item I give & bequeath  
to my son Peter Wolf the Manor plantation House &  
all the Lands belonging to thence unto to him & his Heirs  
forever only Excepting a free right & privilege in all  
for myself & my wife Elizabeth during both of our lives  
Item I give to my wife Elizabeth one Cow & Calf also two  
Sheep, one bed & furniture, one Mere & saddle one Spis  
wing wheel & Padd, one Barn, one pot, one little one  
Table & the drapery & as much that stands in it as  
she wants during her life also three pounds of wax &  
pounds of pitched Cotton, one Chest; Item I give & bequeath  
to my Eldest son Phillip Wolf His one shillings to each  
child; Item I give to my Son George Wolf His one dollar;  
Item I give & bequeath to my children as follows viz—
