hereby utterly disallow revoke & disannul all & every former will
& testamentary legacies & bequeaths by me in any time before mentioned.
& Item I bequeath & confirming this & no other to be
my last will & testament, the witnesses whose names I have hereunto set
our hands & seals this 28th day of March 1797 & hereby further add to this
will by way of codicil, that one John of Pollard were that was not here

to pay my said debt & all my just debts to be paid out of it & other
provisions made in the will, & the remaining part to be for the use of

I do also I bequeath that testifying & confirming this & no other to be
my last will & testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set
our hands & seals this 28th day of March 1797 & hereby further add to this
will by way of bequest, that one kitem of Pollard were that was not before
mentioned in the above will, I desire to employ some suitable person
to view said kitem & all my just debts to be paid out of it & other
provisions made in the will, & the remaining part to be for the use of
my wife & son James Miller. Witness our hands & seals the day &
