 mind & memory Thanks ~~my~~ unto God, calling unto
 mind the mortality of my bod & knowing that it is appointed
 in all men once to die, do make & declare this my last will
 & Testament, That is to say Principally & first of all I give
 & recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God that
 govern it & my body I recommend to the Earth to be buried
 in decent Christian burial at the discretion of my
 Executors nothing doubting but at the General Resur-
 rection I shall receive the same again by the mighty
 power of Gods hand as touching such worldly Estate
 wherewith it has pleased God to bless me in this life
 I give devise & dispose of the same in the following
 manner & form; First, I give Twenty Shillings to the
 poor & likewise I give the year wh to my my dear
 beloved wife the negro boy & her halfe; my estate to be
 sold & divided out together with all my household goods
 Debts & Land & moveable effects only herbed is observed
 to herself. Also I give to my well beloved Cousin Micken
 Ruedasell all my wearing clothes; Also I give to my
 well beloved Daughter Elizabeth Ruedasell the half
 of all my Estate, and likewise I constitute make
 declare Mary Ruedasell my sole Executrix of the
 my last will & Testament, but I do hereby believe,

doe allowe Anover & disannul all & every other former
Testaments, Wills, Legacies, bequests & Sacraments by me in any wise
before written & be given, & doe hereby certifye that no other
to be my last will & testament, & doe hereby certifye that I
have hereunto set my hand & the day of March
in the year of our Lord 1762

discretion of my Executors without doubting but at the
general resurrection I shall receive the same again by
the mighty power of God. And as Touching such worldly

estate as I have with it with pleased God to bless me in
this life, I give & dispose of the same in the manner

following Viz. I give & bequeath to Rebeck
my dearly beloved wife one half of all my moveable estate
with a maintenance of the plantation I now live on during
her life; also to my well beloved daughter Prache
Phillips two Cows, also I give to my son Thomas Beany
five shillings Sterling; also I give to my son William
Beany five shillings Sterling; also I give to my son John
