

In the name of God Amen. I Philip Weeks of New Hampshire  
 County & State of New Hampshire, being weak of body, but of  
 perfect mind & memory, have thought proper to make & by  
 these presents do make & ordain this my last will & Testament  
 disannulling & disallowing of all other wills be me hereto  
 fore made or that may be produced in anywise or by any  
 person with power, allowing of this & this only to be my, last  
 will & Testament, and in first place I do nominate and  
 appoint & by these presents do make & ordain my son  
John John Weeks my whole & sole executor of this my last  
 will & Testament; And now Touching such worldly Estate  
 as it has pleased God to bless me with, It is my will and  
 desire that all my Just debts be paid out of my Estate &  
 the balance or remainder of my property, I will & begeth  
 in following manner viz- Item the first I give and  
 begeth to my son John Weeks all my plantation that  
 I own here on containing three hundred & twenty acres be  
 the same more or less & one negro man whose name is Leely  
 & one negro woman whose name is Leely & one negro boy  
 whose name is Leely and all their increase forever to him  
 & his heirs forever Item It is my will & desire that my beloved  
 wife Elizabeth Weeks shall have her life interest in  
 & use in the plantation & live on & full use of the above  
 named negro woman Spha During her my wife Elizabeth  
 natural life & then to remain as above begeth to my son  
John Weeks & his heirs forever - Further I do will & it is  
 my desire & I do will & begeth to my beloved wife  
Elizabeth Weeks two beds with their furniture & all  
 my household & kitchen furniture, & moreover to be of her  
 own choice with her & all & which & one Lane to be of  
 her own choice - Item I do further will & it is my desire  
 that all the balance of my property of whatever nature it  
 may be that is not specially begeth here shall be sold

on a credit of Twelve months to be approached as here  
 after directed. Item I do will & bequeath to my son in law  
Elijah McCulloch & my Daughter Jenny the said Elijah  
McCulloch's wife the sum of six hundred dollars to be levied  
 & collected out of my Estate; Further it is my desire that it  
 shall be paid in the following manner & form by my  
 Executor viz Two hundred dollars Twelve months after  
 the day of the sale of my property, & the balance to be paid  
 annually to wit Two hundred Dollars Twelve months  
 after the first payment, & two hundred dollars (the last  
 payment) to be made Twelve months after the second  
 payment which aforementioned six hundred dollars I  
 allow to my son in law Elijah McCulloch full power for  
 his use & his heirs forever. Lastly it is my will and  
 desire that any surplus arising out of my Estate after  
 satisfying the before mentioned bequeathments I do will  
 that they do go to my son John Weeks and his heirs  
 signed sealed & pronounced & declared to be the  
 last will & Testament in the presence of us who  
 signed in presence of each other this 28<sup>th</sup> day of March 1809
