In the name of God Amen. I Philip Wolf of the County of  
Muhlenberg & State of N<sup>o</sup> Carolina being weak of body but  
of sound & perfect sense & memory blessed be God for it, & willing  
to mind the uncertainty of life & that it is appointed for  
man once to die, I recommend my soul into the hands of  
God that gave it, & my body to be buried in a Christian  
like manner at the discretion of my Executors. On this 5<sup>th</sup>  
day of August in the Year of our Lord 1814 I do make  
Publish this my last Will & Testament in the manner  
& form following that is to say. Item I give & bequeath  
to my son Peter Wolf the Manor plantation House &  
all the Land belonging to the same to him & his Heirs  
for ever only Excepting a free right & privilege in all  
for myself & my wife Elizabeth during with of our lives  
Item, I give to my wife Elizabeth one Cow & calf, about ten  
sheep, one bed & furniture, one mare & saddle one spi-  
rting wheel & cart, one barn, one pot, one kettle one  
table & the clothes & as much that she wants as  
she wants during her life also three pounds of flux 8<sup>oz</sup>  
pounds of picked cotton, one chest, Item, I give & bequeath  
to my Eldest son Phillip Wolf His one dollar to each  
child, Item I give to my son Jacob Wolf His one Dollar  
Item I give & bequeath to my children as follows viz -

Henry Wolf, Mary Fisher, Elizabeth Peninger, George Wolf  
 Jacob Wolf, Conrad Wolf the remaining part of my estate  
 is not given. It my will & desire should be equally divid-  
 ed among these six Children whose names are above  
 mentioned in this gift, and my will & desire is that the  
 Receipt that stands against Henry Wolf for eighty six dollars  
 is to be taken in his part, and also the Receipt that stands  
 against George Wolf for Eighty Eight Dollars & fifty cents to  
 be taken in his part, and also the Receipt that stands  
 against John Peninger for sixteen Dollars & twenty two  
 cents should be taken with his part, as also the Receipt  
 that stands against Jacob Wolf to the amount of  
 seventy two dollars should be taken in with his part  
Item I do hereby make, constitute & ordain my sons  
 Henry Wolf & Peter Wolf to be my Executors of this my last  
 will & Testament In Witness whereof I the said Philip  
 have hereunto this my last will set my hand & seal the day  
 & date above written—

 viz Supremacy It is my will that all my Just debts to be paid

 bequeath to my beloved wife Beulah her residence on the  
 farm on which I now live during her natural life  
 together with one bed & furniture, one Tea kettle one Dishes  
 one, two pots, one set of cups & saucers, one set of plates—
