according to this my said will & Testament, & I make & declare  
with all other will & Testaments by me before made & declare  
this, only, to be my last will & Testament, In confirmation  
whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal dated the 2<sup>d</sup> day of  
July 1791. in the 15<sup>th</sup> of American Independence -

that I desire that all my just debt, & funeral charges be paid &  
discharged by my executors herein after named -  
First I give & bequeath unto James Rivers son of John Rivers  
one Negro boy named Africa -

2d I give & bequeath unto Nancy Rivers Daughter of said John  
Rivers one Negro woman named Anna together with her increase  
after she the said Nancy Rivers arrives to the age of 18 years at Marriage  
get I Well & give & bequeath the increase of said Negro woman by  
any until the aforesaid Nancy Rivers arrives at the age of

6 Eighteen years or thereabouts unto James & Thomas Rivers sons of the said John Rivers to be equally divided between them.

I give & bequeath unto my loving Sister Mason Fort now in Virginia all that money & clothing that now belongs to me viz that money that lies in Virginia in Capt David Mason's hands being the hire or wages of the slaves and negroes but in case she dies before she arrives at the age of 18 years, then in such case I will bequeath the aforesaid money & clothing before mentioned unto my loving Sister Frances Fort.

I do hereby will & order that the before mentioned negroes Alice & Nan be in the care & at the disposal of John Rivers until the aforesaid James & Nancy Rivers arrive at age or marriage together with the increase (if any) before will'd & given to the said Jones and Thomas Rivers I. j. p. and.

Lastly I do hereby nominate, constitute & appoint my Trusty friend & Brother in Law, John Rivers & Son in Holloway my Executrix of this my last will & Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the 25<sup>th</sup> day of January A.D. 1781 —

I Ephraim Fort of Westmoreland County State of N Carolina being here in bodily heat of sound mind & memory blessed by God, this day the 22<sup>nd</sup> of September in the year of our Lord 1784 make & publish this my last will & Testament in manner & form following viz. First I give & bequeath unto my beloved wife Margaret her bed & furniture three draper & furniture with four covers & four beds & a negro girl slave named Anna & the Chest & Table & chairs & a big house & black mare & all the plantation tools except a hoe one & one Mattock one pair of plow hoes. and I further give to her a bed of batthe & twenty pounds in money and the rest of the plantation on which stand a white Skidmore my residence & in case she should marry in consideration of the same I give the same to my son David Twenty five
