The Recopulation will of Robert Dandy declared to the
Subscribing witnesses on Saturday the 12th day of October 1823
1st It is my wife Dolores that can demand Dollars deducted from the
value of hand in my profession given by my late brother Washington
Dandy which said sum hundred dollars I give to my said brother
for his Deam ~~dear~~ use - & I give to my sister Mary Daniel
my Negro girl Nancy now at my, father's side, her Head & Capes
3rd Dolores that my sonder named Executor as soon as money
can be collected from my debts pay all my just debts -

4th After the above expenses & my debts are satisfied the last
sum due on the note, now in my possession together with
eight Dollars & fifty cents due on account by Ephraim
Hendrick with every thing else which they belong to me
I give & bequeath to my beloved Brother William Dandy
for his friendly services to me in my present illness taking
and his fees forever

5th I appoint my brother William Dandy my only
Executor to this my last will in presence of
Stephen Fox

In the name of God amen. I Robert Dunn being weak in body but
of sound memory blessed by God. I do this first day of November
in the year of our Lord 1824 make & publish this my last will &
testament in the following manner that is to say first I do give
to my loving wife Ann Dunn the part of the land that they live
on during her life a widowhood then to my son Robert Dunn
