" In the name of God Amen, The 3^d day of September in the year of our Lord 1790 I Richard Hudson of Mecklenburg County & State of N^o Carolina being in a distressing weak state of body, but of perfect mind & memory thank be to God for his mercies & calling to mind the mortality of my body and that it is appointed unto all men once to die, Do make & ordain this my last will & Testament, that is to say principally & first of all I recommend my soul to Almighty God who gave it & my body to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian manner at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection I shall revive the same again by the mighty power of God. And as touching my worldly estate whereunto it hath pleased God to bestow me in this life, I give devise and dispose of in the following manner & form, My Executors give & bequeath unto Providence my well beloved wife all my Estate Real & Personal during her widowhood & if she marry again the part or estate to be equally divided between Joseph & Richard my two youngest sons also unto Thomas my beloved son one Dollar to my beloved son Edward one Dollar, also to my well beloved Daughter one Cent & my well beloved Son & my well beloved Daughter & my well beloved Daughter, also to my well beloved Daughter one Cent & my well beloved Daughter one Cent & my well beloved Daughter one Cent, also to my well beloved Son Joseph the plantation known by the name of Stokes containing two hundred acres to be by him when he comes of age but in case that he die or both die before they come of age then his or their part shall be equally divided between my four Daughters Hannah & Providence Elizabeth & Mary, also to my well beloved Daughter Elizabeth one hundred acres, Providence my wife & James Hill & Constable or claim & appoint Executors of this my last will & Testament and I do hereby disallow revoke & disannul all and every

After he had read, examined, perused, & reviewed by me in
my house before writing, written & subscribed, Acknowledging & confirming
this & no other to be my last will & Testament. In testimony whereof
I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 16th day of June above written

Increase, It is my will & desire that this Negro woman Judy with
all her future increase to be equally divided her amongst all
her Children, I give this above named Negro boy Newman
to Henry Smartt a son of Little Berry Smartt & take his wife
to him & his heirs for ever And lastly I appoint my loving
wife Rebecca Thomas my Executor & I declare this to this
to be last will & Testament Respecting all others as wit
ness I have set my hand & seal this 16th day of October 1795
