In the name of God Amen. I Richard Kinsinger of the County of Meck  
lenburg & State of Carolina, knowing that life is uncertain have  
thought proper to make this my last will & Testament in manner &  
form following. It is my will & desire that all my just debts,  
& funeral charges be punctually discharged and paid.

Provisions This my will & I do hereby require all my real & personal estate  
to be appraised by three freeholders chosen by my executors hereafter  
named. Which Estate I do hereby will & bequeath unto my beloved  
wife Elizabeth to be by her possessed during her life or widowhood  
subject nevertheless to the following bequestsments.

Item I Will & bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth & my sons Henry  
Winfred, Richard, Isaac & Charles the whole of my estate except  
Thirty five pounds to my wife Elizabeth & the like sum of Twenty  
five pounds to my son Henry in addition to the others. Also

the bequests mentioned excepted Item I will &  
bequeath to my grandson Richard Hudson son of James Hudson ten pounds

Item I Will & bequeath to my stepson John Little the sum of two hundred  
& Ninety dollars to be paid in six months after my death. I also  
will & bequeath to my stepson four head of horse creatures that now

go by the names of his big one barrel mare called the Sheep & her

three colts to him his heirs & assigns forever. Item I will & bequeath

make over, convey & transfer unto my two sons Henry & Charles

Hudson all that tract of land situated lying & being in

the County of Rockingham beginning the Town of Blackstone con-

tinuing four hundred & Sixty nine acres by that more or less to

be equally divided between my two sons by one share & one share

and further it is my will & desire that the above division be valued

by three freeholders according to quality & quantity & provided also

that if the said valuation amounts to more than there ye-

spective of my said estate, then in that case they shall pay

unto my other legatees the said Battalions to cause to make all my

legatees share & have alike & further if the valuation should

not correspond to these just proportionable shares, then in that

Case my Executors are required to make their Affairs quiet out  
of my Estate, and it is further my will that my beloved wife Elizabeth  
remain in possession of the house and premises during her natural  
life or widow hood from the 1<sup>st</sup> day of September, 1800, to my son Henry & confirm  
unto my Executors hereafter named all my houses & lots in the Town  
of Charlotte to him & his heirs to them & their assigns forever in trust  
for the benefit of my legatees. It is my will that at the decease  
or marriage of my wife Elizabeth, my Executors hereafter named  
do put to sale all the aforesaid houses & lots in the Town of  
Charlotte apiece & the money arising therefrom to be divided  
as before settled share & share alike. 1800 It is further my will so  
clearly that if any of my legatees should die before the come of  
age then & in that case their share or shares shall be equally divided  
among the survivor or survivors. — And lastly, I do hereby  
nominate constitute & appoint my beloved wife Elizabeth  
& Jason Eastman my son Henry & Jason & my Trusty friends  
George Graham & one Alexander Pennington of this my last  
will & Testament, hereby revoking & disannulling all other  
former wills, Bequests & Executors by me heretofore made or  
written. Ratifying & confirming this & no other to be my last  
will & Testament. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my  
hand & signed my book the 25<sup>th</sup> day of April in the year of our Lord 1800  
Signed, sealed, published, pronounced & declared by Richard  
Richard Mason as his last will & Testament in the presence  
of us, who in the names of each other have subscribed our  
names as witnesses.
