In the name of God begin. I Richard Robison of
County of Mecklenburg State of N. Carolina being under
sicknes of body but of sound & disposing mind & memory
Do make & ordaine my last will & testament in the manner and
form following Viz. that my will is that all my just debts
be paid - and as to the rest of my property my will is
that it be distributed in the following manner Viz.
To my son Alexander Robison all that piece or parcel
of land as laid down on plat filed with this Court which
his name is written the boundaries of the said land will
appear by referring to said plat as the courses are all run
down & the lines all run out & are well known to my son
To my son John Robison my bay mare which his has at
this time in his possession, also about 6 Calf & 1 calf
to my son John Robison all that piece or parcel of
land laid down in the aforesaid plat on which his
name is written & bounded as described in said Plat
To my son William Robison fifty dollars in cash
To my daughter Mary Negro girl Sophia my bay m^e -
Buck her Saddle & Bridle & two Bits & some more -
To my son Michael Robison the two parcels or pieces of
land laid down on the aforesaid plat of his name written on
them, also my young Sorrel mare called but one two
hors plow - To my son Willis Robison all that piece
or parcel of Land designated on said plat as the old pen
on which is written subject to the following reser-
-vations Viz. my two unmarried daughters to have an
This part of my plantation given them the mansion house
may be - or on

white they can singe. Also to my said son Walter my
young house paucy one hundred pounds to my daughter
Elizabeth my negro girl about six years old was to have
two hundred pounds & fifty dollars in Lodon To my
Daughter Eliza my negro girl named like my old mare
rosy that I had to her things and last but not least there
also my horses and for the comfortable maintenance
of my family living with me or inclosing on the place
after my decease. I will that one hundred & fifty bushels
of corn all the flour bacon or hams & the fat & odd
& the stock of coffee & sugar on hand I allow them things
to remain for the comfortable maintenance of my family
I allow my negro man named fresh to remain on the
farm three years for the support of my two unmarried
Daughters & then to be sold & equally divided among
my children, And the remainder of my property not
willed above I direct to be sold at public vendue &
after my debts are paid whatever remains of my estate
my will is that it be equally divided among all my
children; And in the last place I appoint my son
Richard Robison & Michael Robison my son in law
William Clark Executors of this my last will and
Testament, & by these presents revoke & make void all
other wills & Testaments by me heretofore & declare
this alone to be my last will & Testament. In witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my
Seal this the 17th of February 1827-
