Do make & ordain this my last will & testament, that is to say
principally & first of all I give & recommend my soul into the
hands of Almighty God who gave it, and my body I recommend
to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian Burial at the direction
of Executors nothing doubting but I shall receive the same again
at the General Resurrection by the mighty power of God
And as touching the worldly estate to me with it hath pleased
God to bless me in this life, I give, devise & dispose of the same
in the following Manner & Form.

First by lawful debts & funeral charges I will that they be
revised & paid out of my estate
To my eldest Brother Thomas Beatty I give & bequeath three
hundred acres of Land lying upon first Broad River near
to the Buck line adjoining Wallace Beatts three hundred acres
providing that he shall pay ten pounds north Carolina Currency
in Gold or Silver to his eldest son, David Beatty, also that he
shall pay ten pounds, at the same rate to each of his
Brothers & Sisters. To my Brother James Beatty I give and
bequeath my Watch partly to be possessed by him. To my Brother
Hugh Beatty all my Surveying Instruments I give & bequeath
to him partly to be possessed of the same. To my Brother Francis
Beatty I give & bequeath the sum of eight pounds in Gold
& Silver notes. To my Brother Wallace I give & bequeath
one Bed & bedding of clothes together with the bedstead partly
to be possessed by him. To my Brother in Law Robert Gray
I give & bequeath the sum of eight pounds agreeable to the rate
& value mentioned. To my Brother by Law Robert Armstrong
I give & bequeath the sum of eight pounds at the same rate
To my Brother John Beatty I give & bequeath my clock to be
possed partly by him. My other & other things not mentioned
I will to be sold at publick Vendue to defray my debts
& Expenses; providing also if these articles should not amount
unto a sum sufficient for defraying my expenses that each of
them Legals shall advance quotas equally untill the

own may be sufficient in paying the debts. I also make, constitute
 & declare my Will that Thomas Bealy & John Bealy to be sole Executors
 of this my last Will & Testament, and do hereby utterly disallow
 revoke & disannul all & every other, Will, Testament, Legacy or
 Bequest or Execution, touching & concerning these Executors which
 to be my last Will & Testament. In Witness whereof I have here
 unto set my hand & seal the day & year above written
 Signed Sealed pronounced & declared by the said
 Robert Bealy as his last Will & Testament in presence
 of us who in the presence of each other have
 hereunto subscribed our names

 day of May in the year of our Lord 1799 make & publish this my last Will
 and Testament in manner following that is to say 1st I allow all
 my last & lawful Debts to be paid.

- 2^d I give & bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth the Twelve pounds five
 shillings which is the share of my son William Brown & further
 the value of all the Beds & household & kitchen furniture
- 3^d I bequeath to my daughter Margaret one horse & Trunk with the
 other half of the household & kitchen furniture one cow & sheep & three
- 4th I bequeath to my daughter Martha the two cows & calves & three Dollars
 which lies in the hands of Mr. Brown & in the amount of what the
 H. g. father, & further the interest of money lent to my son
 Robert after expenses are disposed to be equally divided between my
 three daughters 5th I bequeath to my son W^m Brown one shilling.
- 6th I bequeath to my son David Brown five shillings &
 one penny, and I appoint my worthy friend G. H. Under Secretary of
 this my last Will & Testament, In Witness whereof I the said David Brown
 have to this my last Will & Testament set my hand & seal the day &
 year above written
