disannulling all Wills & former Wills by me made, maintain-  
ing this to be my last will & Testament, so witnesseth myself I  
have hereunto set my hand & seal this first day of July in the  
Year of our Lord 1810 -

In the Name of God, amen I Robert Bigham of Mecklenburg  
county N Carolina of sound mind memory calling to mind the mor-  
tality of this earthly body & that it is appointed for all men to die  
no contradiction & declare & appoint this my last will & Testament  
I do this the most Humblye committing my soul to God who gave it & earnestly  
 beseeching his most gracious acceptance. My body to the church  
to be buried decently in the grave where my father was laid. The  
disposition of my executors, not desiring but that I shall rest  
the same again at the general Resurrection -

I do now make all my just debts to be paid out of the Wills  
I leave - Then I will & bequeath to my dearly beloved Daughter  
Jane Farmer one half & procedure also my share of Deacons. Likewise  
one half of all my wifes property after my legal debts are paid -  
I will & bequeath to my well beloved son Robert Bigham the folente  
Item on which I trust him & all my other lands my Waggon, Wagon  
Guns & Cloth, also a Negroe man named Eli, two Horses his own  
choice, two plows and two pair of gees - Item I will bequeath

all the notes due me after my debts are paid & out of them, like  
 as I see fit the sum of one half a plow which is in Boston at  
 this time. Then I will & bequeath to my husband son Robert  
 Bigham, my book & furniture. Then I will & bequeath to my  
 well beloved daughter Josephine Bigham one full suit of body cloth  
 such as she would choose above my best Barb. Slave. I will make  
 my Negro woman named Rose shall have her choice whether  
 to go with my Daughter Jane Turner or stay with my son Robt.  
 Bigham to be subject to either of them as my unmarried property  
 if this does not seem consistent with either of them she is  
 to be sold & the proceeds equally divided between my daughter  
 Jane Turner & my son Robert Bigham then I will to  
 my Negro woman Rose anything which as long as she  
 remains with either of my children. Then I will to my  
 well beloved son Robert Bigham & Jane Turner divide  
 between my large Bible & wills the one, son Robert Bigham  
 & Jane Turner divide the rest of my books & joys as they see  
 proper the balance to be sold.

And lastly I appoint my well beloved son Robert Bigham  
 & my well beloved son in law James Turner to be my executors of  
 this my last will & testament. And hereby disown all right  
 all others. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand seal  
 this 2<sup>d</sup> day of May in the year of our Lord 1815

 Mecklenburg State of Carolina being in a weak & low situa-  
 tion of body but of sound disposing mind do make & ordain and  
 publish this my last will & testament in manner & form as follows  
 viz. I commit my soul to Almighty God who I am at my death  
 to the dust to be buried in hope of a resurrection at his
