In the name of God. Amen I Robert Higham of Mecklenburg
County N Carolina of sound mind & memory calling to mind the mor-
tality of this earthly body & that it is appointed for all men to die
do constitute & declare & appoint this my last will & Testament
In which I do most Humbly commit my soul to God who gave it & humbly
beseeching his most gracious acceptance; My body to the church
to be buried decently in the grave where my father was laid at the
direction of my Executors, not doubting but that I shall receive
the same again at the general Resurrection -

Item I do bequeath all my just debts to be paid out of the notes
due me - Item I will & bequeath to my dearly beloved daughter
Jaze Turner one book & penmanship, also my case of drawers, likewise
one half of all my well to property after my legal debts are paid -

Item I will & bequeath to my well beloved son Robert Higham the planta-
tion on which I now live & all my other lands my Wagon, Wagon
Gear & cloth, also a negro boy named Eli, two horses his own
chaise, two plows and two pair of gears - Item I will & bequeath

all the notes due me after my debts are paid out of them, like
 - write the proceeds of one half of them which is in the collection at
 this time. Then I will be generous to my beloved son Robert
 Higham. one book & furniture. Then I will be generous to my
 well beloved brother Joseph Higham one full suit of body cloth
 such as he would choose also my best hat. Then I will that
 my negro woman named Anne shall have her choice whether
 to go with my daughter Jane Turner or stay with my son
 Robert Higham to be valued to either of them as my unwilling property
 if she does not seem contented with either of them she is
 to be sold & the proceeds equally divided between my daughter
 Jane Turner & my son Robert Higham. Then I will to
 my negro woman Anne as finding wheel as long as she
 remains with either of my children. Then I will to my
 well beloved son Robert Higham & Jane Turner each
 a new large Bible & write that I my son Robert Higham
 & Jane Turner divide the rest of my books as far as they see
 proper the balance to be sold.

And lastly I appoint my well beloved son Robert Higham
 & my well beloved son in law James Turner to be my Executors &
 this my last will & Testament. And do hereby disavow & reject
 all others. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal
 this 2^d day of May in the Year of our Lord 1845

At the Court of said County. William Boaly of the County of
 Mecklenburg & State of N. Carolina being in a weak & low situa-
 - tion of body but of sound disposing mind; Do make his claim and
 publish this my last will & Testament in manner & form as follows
 viz. I commit my soul to Almighty God who gave it & my body
 to the dust to be buried in a grave at Greensboro in manner at the
 discretion of my Executors, and as to my worldly estate I bequeath
