likewise three Horses one Bay I am Adam & one Sorrel likewise
one Mare & bay colt, likewise all my Stock of Cattle now in
my possession, likewise all my household furniture, also my bed
& its furniture -- Item To my well beloved Hannah hisers I leave
one Dollar also her bed & furniture and her saddle --

Item To my well beloved Daughter Ben I leave one Dollar & her cloath,

Item To my well beloved Daughter Jane Brown I leave one Dollar &
her cloath & her bed & furniture and her saddle --

Item To my well beloved Daughter Elvener I leave one Dollar & her cloath,
and her bed & furniture & her saddle, -- Item to my well beloved
Daughter Mary Brown now Mary Maxwell I leave one Dollar

Item I leave to my youngest beloved daughter Catharine and Dortha
her cloath & her bed & furniture -- Item to my well beloved
Daughter Susanna I leave one Dollar & her cloath --

Item To my well beloved son Richard I leave my plantation I now
live on only my wife to have her living out of it as above mentioned
also my wagon & gear to be put to his use as my Rifle gun --
Given under my hand & seal the 26th day of February 1769
